Notes & Examples:

There are a maximum of 31 days in a modern calendar month.

There are 39 books in the Old Testament, 27 books in the New Testament, 66 books total.

"...and in the midst of the week he shall cause the sacrifice and the oblation to cease..." Daniel 9:27, Heb. 10:11-12

In the midst of the week is Wednesday, where the Old Testament ends and the New Testament begins afterwards.

The Old Testament way of sacrifice and oblation for achieving righteousness ends, in the fourth column.

Faith in Jesus begins in the 5th column (5th millenium) with the New Testament, starting with book 40 which is Matthew.

The physical world has four dimensions, but the spirit world starts with the 5th dimension, where faith operates.

Per E.W. Bullinger, the number 5 means grace: "For by grace are ye saved through faith..." Ephesians 2:8

Jesus is in the 5th column, which is Thursday. Jesus was crucified on a Thursday, not on a Friday.

Books match books, books match chapters, and chapters match chapters.

The book of John is the 43rd book and it is in the 1st column with the book of Genesis, the 1st book.

Genesis 1 / John 1: "In the beginning...", "light", "every thing that he had made / All things were made by him", etc.

The book of John is on the first day of the week, Sunday. From John 20:1 is the following verse:

"The first day of the week cometh Mary Magdalene early, when it was yet dark, unto the sepulchre, and seeth the stone taken away..."

Jesus rose very early on the 1st day of the week (see also Mark 16:9), at the dawn of a new day: Let there be light!

Column one, Romans 8 and John 1: "manifestation of the sons of God / to them gave he power to become the sons of God".

1 Cor. 15:23 "But every man in his own order: Christ the firstfruits; afterward they that are Christ's at his coming."

The 2nd part of the resurrection of the just to occur on the Feast of Firstfruits, on the 1st day of the week?! Let there be light!

Gen. 1 and Rev. 22 both with "water, tree, fruit, light, sun". The beginning and end of the Bible, both in column one... back to full circle.

Column one: Revelation Chapters 1 and 22 - Jesus said "I am Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end...", back to full circle.

Column one represents the beginning and the end, i.e. the 12:00 location on a clock where one cycle stops and another begins.

Column seven contains books / chapters 7, 14, and 21. Thus, Revelation chapters 7, 14, and 21 should match in some way.

Revelation 7:3 "...till we have sealed the servants of our God in their foreheads."

Revelation 14:1 "...having his Father's name written in their foreheads."

Revelation 21: ... no direct reference to a seal or name in the forehead? Check a shadow chapter to see if it is there.

Revelation 22:4 "...and his name shall be in their foreheads." (shadow chapter for Rev. 21)
