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INTRODUCTION

This book continues the study of scriptural patterns in the Bible as presented in the original volume of <u>The Two Witnesses</u>.

The principle of the testimony of two witnesses is a pattern found throughout the Bible and, in many cases, it is three or more witnesses.

"...In the mouth of two or three witnesses shall every word be established."

2 Corinthians 13:1

This second volume of <u>The Two Witnesses</u> is composed of several sections of material. Chapters 1-5 are the first section with subject matter concerning various aspects of the seed of promise or the man child. Chapters 6-26 cover various topics in the Bible. Chapters 27-31 concern types of heavenly beings, their roles, and comparisons with the attributes of Jesus. Finally, there are appendices with different types of material for the reader's reference.

This book contains the revealed Word of God and is a gift:

"The secret *things belong* unto the LORD our God: but those *things which are* revealed *belong* unto us and to our children for ever, that *we* may do all the words of this law."

Deuteronomy 29:29

As before in the first volume, this book presents the information in two parts: the Bible pattern and the interpretation of the pattern. The following verse highlights the existence of patterns:

"The thing that hath been, it *is that* which shall be; and that which is done *is* that which shall be done: and *there is* no new *thing* under the sun." Ecclesiastes 1:9

Finally, the reader is strongly exhorted to have their heart right with the Lord before looking into this book, as stated previously in the original volume of <u>The Two Witnesses</u>:

"And he smote the men of Bethshemesh, because <u>they had looked into the ark of the LORD</u>, even he smote of the people fifty thousand and threescore and ten men: and the people lamented, because the LORD had smitten *many* of the people with a great slaughter. And the men of Bethshemesh said, Who is able to stand before this holy LORD God? and to whom shall he go up from us?" 1 Samuel 6:19-20

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CHAPTER 1

BODY OF CHRIST

This Bible pattern consists of a four-column comparison. The left column is Old Testament Joseph, the middle two columns are about Jesus, and the right column is about the Body of Christ. There are some very awesome insights contained in these scriptures. Even though the pattern provides deeper revelation, there are still certain things that are not well understood because of the limitations of the logical, carnal mind. Without a corresponding experience to provide a frame of reference, the carnal mind does not comprehend the deeper things of the Holy Spirit. Let us now review the depth of this Bible pattern.

We are all familiar with the story of Joseph's coat of many colors; but we have never really understood its spiritual significance, other than it was a gift of love from his father. Because of the pattern, we can see that the coat of many colors symbolizes the 40 generations of Jesus Christ, from Abraham to Jesus. God the Father gave this gift of love to His son Jesus. The concept of this is staggering, when trying to understand the depth of it. Each reader is highly recommended to go before the Lord and to thank Him for His generosity. It is a gift of such generosity that we cannot understand at this time the total significance of it without more revelation from the Lord.

The pattern match-up between the columns is astounding and greatly encourages believers in Jesus because it provides a peek at the future gift of love that awaits His Body of Christ. The "manifestation of the sons of God" (Romans 8:19) is an event in the near future of <u>tremendous</u> impact and yet, it is largely unstudied and unreported, even by Christian authors. The following verse concerns this event:

"Beloved, now are we the sons of God, and it doth not yet appear what we shall be: but we know that, when he shall appear, we shall be like him; for we shall see him as he is. And every man that hath this hope in him purifieth himself, even as he is pure." 1 John 3:2-3

There are two types of fulfillment: type 1 and type 2. The type 1 fulfillment takes place when a person gets saved or born again. They pass from death unto life. Their "old man" dies and the "new man" comes forth to serve the Lord. They become the sons (and daughters) of God:

"Therefore if any man *be* in Christ, *he is* a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new." 2 Corinthians 5:17

The type 2 fulfillment occurs at the Second Coming of Jesus:

"For the Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of God: and the dead in Christ shall rise first: Then we which are alive *and* remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord." 1 Thess. 4:16-17

This is known as the rapture or the "catching away". For those who are deceased and buried, at the catching away their body is resurrected from the grave, joins with their spirit and soul which has been in heaven all this time, and then becomes one with the Lord. Those who are alive and remain will fly straight up into the clouds to be one with the Lord. The pattern has already been established by the resurrection of Jesus from the grave.

"...*I pray God* your whole spirit and soul and body be preserved blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ." 1 Thess. 5:23b

If we Christians think that we are going to be raptured without the children of Israel, we better think again.

"Brethren, my heart's desire and prayer to God for Israel is, that they might be saved." Romans 10:1

In the near future, Jesus is going to be revealing himself to the remnant of Israel and He is going to use a number of Christians for this purpose. Better get ready Christian; to be called upon when Jesus comes knocking on your door. Woe unto that Christian who says NO, who chooses convenience instead of sacrifice in that day! Woe unto that Christian who tries to save his life and instead will lose it! He shall experience weeping and gnashing of teeth, for eternity! But blessed is he who receives the children of Israel in their time of need. Faithful is that servant who is watchful and waiting when the Lord comes at an unexpected hour.

"Whosoever shall receive this child in my name receiveth me..." Luke 9:48a

Hey Christian! When the children of Israel arrive at your doorstep needing refuge or provision, make yourself available. In so doing, you are serving the Lord himself. Study the pattern on the next four pages and see how Joseph made himself available to his brethren and how he was blessed afterwards. Also, observe how the pattern shall repeat in the last days. The time is almost upon us. Are you ready?

CHAPTER 2

LUKE 1 & MATTHEW 2

The pattern illustrates a match-up between the two subject chapters, concerning the time period of the births of John the Baptist and of Jesus. The main points are:

- Herod is a type of antichrist.

- The visitation of the Lord and/or His representative(s) results in one of two reactions: troubling fear or rejoicing.

- The visitation of the Lord offers great promises and expectations for God's people but represents a major threat to the devil's kingdom.

- The result is that the devil mobilizes his forces to seek out and destroy the seed of promise, causing God's people to flee.

- The Lord delivers His anointed from the enemy and the devil's representative is defeated.

- God's people return back to their land.
- The Lord's anointed carry out their mission and fulfill God's Word.

One specific point to notice is that John the Baptist grew up in the desert until the Lord revealed him at his appointed time. Many of God's anointed originate from the desert. The wilderness of the Bible is a type of desert. Christians go through wilderness / desert experiences for spiritual preparation prior to the fullness of their calling. The flesh and the lusts thereof typically perish in the wilderness. The result is a focus on God's vision for what needs to be accomplished. Each of us needs to maximize the benefits from our own wilderness experience and not to look upon it as a negative time in our life.

From the pattern, we see a parallel between Herod and the devil:

Herod (#1)

Attempts to slay all the young children, two years old and younger, at the time when Jesus and John the Baptist were infant children. The Devil (round 1)

Tempts Jesus in the wilderness, in order to bring about the downfall of Jesus at the infancy of His ministry.

<u>Herod (#2)</u> Beheads John the Baptist. The Devil (round 2) Has Jesus crucified.

The object lesson is that the devil knows who the Lord's anointed are and will try to prevent the start of their ministry. Christians should not be surprised at the resistance they encounter at the start of their walk with the Lord. It means that they are on the right path. Also, the devil cannot end a Christian's life unless the Lord allows it. If He allows it then it will be for a greater purpose and the Christian receives a greater reward in heaven.

"Blessed are ye, when *men* shall revile you, and persecute *you*, and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely, for my sake. Rejoice, and be exceeding glad: for great *is* your reward in heaven: for so persecuted they the prophets which were before you." Matthew 5:11-12

Compare this chapter with Chapter 4, The 144,000, and study how it fits into the big picture of the last days.

CHAPTER 3

REVELATION 12 / DANIEL 12 & LUKE 4

This chapter consists of a series of patterns that are not in chronological order; thus, for a chronology study the reader is encouraged to review Chapters 28, 29, 30, and 34 of Volume One of <u>The Two</u> <u>Witnesses</u>. After a review of these four chapters and after considering the pattern of this chapter, we can understand that the Israeli remnant that flees into the wilderness will be nourished with the Word of God. Chapter 46 of Volume One suggests that a certain remnant of born-again believers may be the ones distributing the "manna" to the Israeli remnant, similar to the disciples of Jesus distributing the loaves and fishes.

The notes column contains additional information concerning the interpretation of the pattern. The focus should remain on the scriptural pattern and less on the notes, in case the Lord provides additional revelation to the reader.

The story of this Bible pattern is as follows: in our desolation the Word of the Lord comes forth. Then the devil comes against us because we represent a threat. God then sends forth a deliver and separates the wicked from the just. Those who humble themselves and believe in the Word of the Lord receive blessing. Those who are too prideful to believe and will not walk by faith receive destruction.

Compare this chapter with Chapter 4, The 144,000, and study how it fits into the big picture of the last days.

CHAPTER 4

THE 144,000

This chapter consists of two sets of scriptures. The first set is the pattern between Genesis, Luke, Revelation, and Judges. The second set is the pattern between Isaiah, Jeremiah, and Ezekiel. Both sets of scriptures match because they have the same pattern. The pattern is as follows:

- 1. Barrenness or Desolation
- 2. The Visitation of the LORD
- 3. Prophetic Word / Voice / Trumpet
- 4. The Seed of Promise Comes Forth (the 144,000)
- 5. Thunder / Earthquake / Rejoicing / First Fruits
- 6. Preaching of the Gospel
- 7. Fall of Babylon
- 8. Forbidden Fruit / Mark of the Beast
- 9. Believers Are Oppressed Then Delivered
- 10. Judgment Upon the Children of Disobedience and Upon the Devil's Kingdom

Other Notes for Consideration

The "woman" is the Body of Christ. The forbidden fruit of the vine is the lust of the world.

In the beginning, the United States began as the garden of Eden but in the end it is compared with the fall of Babylon.

Judgment upon the third part of creation parallels the judgment upon the third part of the angels that fell from grace. (ref. Rev. 8:7-9 and Rev. 12:4, 9)

The advent of the 144,00 is one of the deeper mysteries of the Bible and it is an earth-shaking event.

Compare this chapter with the three preceding chapters and study how their patterns fit into the big picture of the last days as revealed in this chapter about the 144,000. Then compare this chapter with the following chapter on Moses to see how close a match there is between the historical and future patterns.

Only the pattern highlights have been presented in the Isaiah / Jeremiah / Ezekiel pattern match due to the volume of scriptures the three books represent. The reader is encouraged to further study the books of Isaiah, Jeremiah, and Ezekiel in order to get more details about the context of the highlights presented here.

CHAPTER 5

LET MY PEOPLE GO

This scripture pattern is set up so that there are four columns of scripture with a "theme scripture" at the top of the four columns. The theme scripture is the subject of the four columns. Following are thirteen pages of scripture patterns and below is a summary of each page.

- P. 1 Theme: Let My People Go.
 - The God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob is Jesus.
 - He is not sent to the proud, except to bring them down so His people can be free to serve God.
 - Oppressed people = burdened people (ministry opportunities).
- P. 2 God gives His Deliverer power to free people.
 His Deliverer must have a humble servant attitude. True humility is to be totally dependent upon God so that there is maximum freedom to serve God and His people.
 Serve God and not money. God provides. Money without God does not provide.
- P. 3 God can use you to do great things when you are submissive and obedient to Him.
 There are enemies of the Word of God whose end is destruction and the devil's kingdom, represented by sea and land, shall fall.
- P. 4 Idolatry is dangerous because it clouds judgment. Men begin to place confidence in their abilities instead of in God. This is especially true with money because God's people begin to think they must have it or they cannot survive or get anything done. When money becomes their source instead of God, then it has become their master whom they shall worship. They are blind fools headed for destruction.

- Instead of associating holiness with an object, it would be preferable to associate holiness with an attitude of the heart. Rituals are nothing without a pure heart. The temple of the Holy Spirit is the focus of holiness, not a physical building or altar.

P. 5 - Man's attempts to build a physical structure unto the glory of God results in corruption. God prefers time and money to be invested in building the lives of God's people; not to enable their problems but to graduate them in order that they may help others with their problems. This brings glory to God, not some ornate building of worship.

- Righteousness is not possible without Jesus so a person needs to understand that to be completely dependent on the Lord results in the ability to walk the holiness walk. Follow the spirit of the law instead of depending on the letter of the law. (2 Corinthians 3:6)

- P. 6 God's prophetic rebuke issues forth upon the religious leadership for their idolatry and misplaced priorities. Those who do not repent seal their fate of damnation.
 When a person pursues a religious life without submitting to the daily leading of the Holy Spirit, the person will instead be led by a demonic religious spirit and be deceived into thinking that violence or bloodshed, in the name of God, is justified.
 Without submitting daily to have our self-will crucified by the Lord, our self-will changes into a law-enforcement beast that persecutes the real believers of God.
- P. 7 At the risk of persecution and even death, the prophetic word of judgment issues forth upon the people of the land. Desolation is on the way.
 Acts 7:57 illustrates how an entire group of people manifest a demonic spirit of religion after the truth cuts them to the heart. When you are full of the Holy Spirit and speaking truth to a group, do not be surprised if someone manifests a hostile spirit of religious spirits. In Acts 7:60, Stephen remitted the sins of those who manifested demons and attacked him. If people are to house any characteristic for the being free free the benders of religion it is important for helioneric in leave (

have any chance of being free from the bondage of religion, it is important for believers in Jesus / Yeshua to remit their sins.

CHAPTER 5

LET MY PEOPLE GO

- If there are not enough believers remitting sin, scripture shows that judgment takes place on those cities, churches, or groups of people who are doing evil and violence in the name of God. (Matt. 10:15, 23:38, Revel. 11:13)

- P. 8 Theme: Pharaoh King of Egypt.
 - <u>Phar</u>aoh = <u>Phar</u>isee

- The adversary is in the form of a religious leader with a religious spirit. This is the "wolf" that Jesus warns about. The religious spirit will use violence to get its way, including verbal, accusatory violence. The believer should hold their peace and remain "harmless as a dove" until the religious storm blows over. The religious person is full of the law but has little love, "...by their fruits ye shall know them." (Matthew 7:20)

P. 9 - Theme: <u>The Devil Pursues God's People</u>.

- Persecution produces new Christians, separates fake Christians from real ones, and gets the gospel spread.

- Those who try to save their life by betraying their brethren will lose their eternal life in hell. - In the spring at some point in the near future, around the time of passover, a prophetic event will take place. The 144,000 will come forth, also referred to as the "man child". It will come at a time of great distress and trouble upon Israel and the USA.

- P. 10 Theme: God Commands His People To Go Forward.
 - God's people flee the persecution. This helps to spread the gospel message.
 - The Lord has a place for His people to flee to. They must leave their former life behind.
- P. 11 Theme: <u>The Lord Executes Judgment Upon The Enemy</u>.
 The devil's servants try to chase after God's people but it will be to their own destruction.
 God's preaching of the Word goes forth and the devil's servants are defeated and never oppress God's people again.
- P. 12 Theme: <u>The Lord Saves His People From The Enemy</u>.
 After a defeat, it is easy to see who the devil's servants are and who the Lord's servants are.
 The Lord's servants are willing to die for their faith, and this assures they have the victory of life.
- P. 13 Theme: <u>The People's Faith In God Increases</u>.
 - For faith to grow, there must be the test of going through the fire.

- God's people who are willing to die for the Lord while going through the fire, realize they make it through alive because God is faithful. This increases their faith so they can be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might. It also produces peace that surpasses all understanding and life is more fulfilling. The reward is more than worth the cost.

CHAPTER 6

RICH MAN POOR MAN

What is the definition of being "rich"? In worldly terms, some people believe that if you have enough money so that you do not have to work, then you are rich. Conversely, if you do not have enough money to eat regularly, then some people believe that is the definition of being poor. So, physical wealth is the state of having an abundance of finances, in order to do what you want to do. Another way to say it is "financial independence" so that you do not have to depend upon anybody. What does the Bible say about being rich?

"I know thy works, that thou art neither cold nor hot: I would thou wert cold or hot. So then because thou art lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will spue thee out of my mouth. Because thou sayest, I am rich, and increased with goods, and have need of nothing; and knowest not that thou art wretched, and miserable, and poor, and blind, and naked:" Revelation 3:15-17

So, the Bible says that to be only physically rich is to be spiritually poor. In that case, what does the Bible say to do?

"I counsel thee to buy of me gold tried in the fire, that thou mayest be rich; and white raiment, that thou mayest be clothed, and *that* the shame of thy nakedness do not appear; and anoint thine eyes with eyesalve, that thou mayest see." Revelation 3:18

"That the trial of your faith, being much more precious than of gold that perisheth, though it be tried with fire, might be found unto praise and honour and glory at the appearing of Jesus Christ:" 1 Peter 1:7

The gold tried in the fire is the trial of our faith! We are to walk the walk and to believe what God has said in His word and to believe what He has put on our heart concerning our daily service to Him. Faith requires us to make a decision and to act upon the decision to show that we believe His Word.

"By faith Moses, when he was come to years, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter; Choosing rather to suffer affliction with the people of God, than to enjoy the pleasures of sin for a season; Esteeming the reproach of Christ greater riches than the treasures in Egypt: for he had respect unto the recompense of the reward." Hebrews 11:24-26

Moses had received a major revelation from the Lord: that spiritual riches are <u>greater</u> than physical riches! This liberated him from the bondage of dependence on the physical world. He could depend on God to supply his needs and thus, be free to serve the Lord. In the end, he knew he would receive an eternal reward.

Part of a Christian's growth is to transition from the pursuit of physical wealth (money) to the pursuit of spiritual wealth (faith). The majority of Christians have a daily job in order to earn a living for their family and this is perfectly fine. The problem arises when the job tries to get in the way of God's calling for the individual. He cannot serve two masters. He cannot choose to work overtime because of the extra money and, as a result, decide to put off the prison outreach trip that he signed up for with his church. To not do what God has put on his heart is called unbelief. When a Christian continues in unbelief they cannot expect to inherit eternal life (Rev. 21:8).

In our daily walk, God says to love and forgive. God says to help the poor. God says to be salt and light. God says not to sin. We will be challenged daily to demonstrate that we believe. So, let us practice believing every day and let us also ask the Lord for His continued help with our daily walk.

One clarification: it is not a sin to be rich with a lot of physical treasure. Abraham, Lot, Joseph, Solomon, and David were rich. But, it is a sin to make money into a god and to treat people differently because they are rich or poor. Study the following Bible pattern with Luke 16 and James 2. It is far better to be spiritually rich and not to trust in uncertain physical riches.

CHAPTER 6

RICH MAN POOR MAN

"And when Simon saw that through laying on of the apostles' hands the Holy Ghost was given, he offered them money, Saying, Give me also this power, that on whomsoever I lay hands, he may receive the Holy Ghost. But Peter said unto him, Thy money perish with thee, because thou hast thought that the gift of God may be purchased with money." Acts 8:18-20

As illustrated by this verse from the book of Acts, it is impossible to exchange physical wealth for spiritual wealth. It is time to fully submit to the Lord now in order to build up our spiritual bank account. As we become spiritually rich, God expects us to give it out. Then, we can see miracles.

"And as ye go, preach, saying, The kingdom of heaven is at hand. Heal the sick, cleanse the lepers, raise the dead, cast out devils: freely ye have received, freely give." Matthew 10:7-8

The deeper understanding of the Bible pattern between Luke 16 and James 2 is that the rich man is a type for a spiritually-rich church, full of the Word of God; yet, the church is not ministering to the spiritual needs of the common people outside of the church's walls. Even the Gentile "dogs", who are supposedly without the knowledge of the Word of God, are ministering charity to the unloved poor. It is a variation of the parable of the good Samaritan.

There was once a true story of a visiting pastor who went to a protestant church where he was scheduled to be a guest speaker. Before church began, he was on the outside step of the church dressed as a homeless man. A significant number of the people entering the church avoided the "homeless" man. His identity was kept hidden until the time when he was introduced to speak. When he stepped forward and the people saw who it was, there was an audible gasp from the congregation. Guess what his sermon was about?

(The dirt on the rich man's grave = the dirt of unbelief.) (Unbelief prevents any possibility of resurrection.)

(Country club-type churches exclusion of "street" people.)

⁴Are ye not then partial in yourselves, and are become judges of evil thoughts?

⁵Hearken, my beloved brethren, Hath not God chosen <u>the poor</u> of this world rich in faith,

...and <u>heirs of the kingdom</u> which he hath promised to them that love him?

⁶But <u>ye have despised the poor</u>. Do not <u>rich men</u> oppress you,

⁶...and draw you before the judgment seats?

⁷Do not they <u>blaspheme that worthy name</u> by the which ye are called?

CHAPTER 7

THE TWO TEMPTATIONS

From this pattern we see that Jesus endured two major periods of temptation in His life, at the beginning of and at the end of His ministry. This is a warning to the rest of us; that we may have to go through the same thing in our ministry.

"The disciple is not above *his* master, nor the servant above his lord." Matthew 10:24

The first temptation of Jesus took place in the wilderness following His baptism. After fasting for 40 days/nights Jesus was tempted with three things that the devil said.

In the second temptation while Jesus was on the cross, the devil used <u>people</u> to say the same three things to Jesus that the devil said when he tempted Jesus in the wilderness. Some of the people that the devil used to tempt Jesus with were the chief priests. Religious people are dangerous. Spiritual people who are led by the Holy Spirit are not dangerous.

"For to be carnally minded *is* death; but to be spiritually minded *is* life and peace." "For if ye live after the flesh, ye shall die: but if ye through the Spirit do mortify the deeds of the body, ye shall live. For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God." Romans 8:6, 13-14

The pattern of temptation used by the devil remains consistent with the pattern discussed in Chapter 3, of the first volume of <u>The Two Witnesses</u>, which is "the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life."

Let us endeavor to use words that Jesus would say and not to use words that the devil would say.

"Let your speech be alway with grace, seasoned with salt, that ye may know how ye ought to answer every man." Colossians 4:6

CHAPTER 8

ISAIAH 61 - LUKE 4 - MATTHEW 5

It is important to study this pattern in order to understand the anointing of Jesus. He came to set the captives free and to bless people. For this, He was persecuted and eventually crucified. The reason is because the devil is the god of this world (2 Cor. 4:4) and wants people to remain in bondage and not to be free. The devil uses religious people to persecute the godly people. This is quite tragic; to be used by the devil for his purposes. It is better to follow Jesus than to be religious.

From the pattern, we see that when Jesus "dropped the bomb" on the Pharisees by saying that the scripture from Isaiah 61 was fulfilled, He was also trying to warn the religious leaders that He was not there to destroy the law or the prophets but to fulfill. The astounding thing is that the Pharisees rejected fulfillment of Bible prophecy. Would not the keepers of the law want Bible prophecy to be fulfilled? But they rejected Jesus as the fulfillment of the prophecy because they judged Him after the flesh. The kingdom of God came suddenly upon the Pharisees and they were not prepared. They rejected the one whom God had sent. Now, they burn in everlasting torment. When someone comes to us in the name of the Lord, no matter how "un-anointed" they look, let us judge after the spirit and not after the flesh. If they have the fruit of the Spirit (Gal. 5:22-23), we need to consider their message.

The pattern gives us a peek at the rewards for being persecuted for the name of Jesus. These are everlasting rewards. They will be more than worth it, so let us remain faithful.

CHAPTER 9

1 SAMUEL & JOHN 6

This chapter is one of those rare, extended-length patterns revealed by the Lord, and it took a significant amount of time to study. The only other pattern *so far* of equal or greater complexity is the chapter of Daniel 11 in the first volume of <u>The Two Witnesses</u>. Glory to God for He is awesome!

The Infinity Bible Code reveals that the Old Testament book 1st Samuel and New Testament chapter John 6 correspond mathematically:

John 6	= 74 th chapter of New Testament
No. of Books in the Bible	= 66
difference	= 8 (1 Samuel is 8 th book of OT and 74 th book of the Bible)

When studying the pattern match-up between 1 Samuel and John 6, it becomes apparent that faith in God is extremely important if miracles are to happen. First, one must consult with the Lord what should be done about a situation. This requires the ability to hear the Lord's voice when He speaks to our heart.

"While it is said, To day if ye will hear his voice, harden not your hearts, as in the provocation." Hebrews 3:15

When He puts it on our heart what we are to do about the Philistine or what we are to do about the five thousand hungry people, then we are equipped with His answer. When given the answer to a problem, the next step that is required is ACTION. When we believe the answer we have received is from God and we act in faith on that belief, then the miracle can take place. We turn the faucet handle because we believe the water will come out. We flip the switch because we believe the light will come on. We demonstrate faith every day in the physical world. It is time to demonstrate faith in the spiritual world and believe God's Word! Now is the time to practice our faith. Others are depending upon it, in order for their faith to increase. After David slew Goliath, then the army of Israel pursued after the Philistines and achieved victory. After Jesus distributed the loaves and fishes to His disciples, then the food multiplied further when the disciples distributed it to the people.

The five smooth stones that David put in his bag represent the five-fold ministry of Ephesians 4:11. The single stone that he chose to slay Goliath with was the prophetic word. Goliath attempted to dictate the terms and conditions of the battle: "Come to me, and I will give thy flesh unto the fowls of the air..." David responded with the prophetic word: "This day will the LORD deliver thee into mine hand; and I will smite thee..." With the prophetic word from the Lord, David put Goliath into a spiritual "box" and the battle was over. All that was left for David to do was to go through the motions and defeat Goliath because it had already happened in the spirit world. David's act of faith in 1.) believing that he had heard an answer from the Lord, 2.) prophesying the ordained result of the battle, and 3.) carrying out the action, resulted in a great victory. The devil hates the prophetic word and, sad to say, the average church is strangely silent in the gift of prophesying or in the voice of the prophet.

Even though Goliath was twice as large as David was physically, David perceived spiritually that he was much larger than Goliath and the battle was a mismatch. The Lord helped David to see the spiritual reality of the situation. In our daily battles, we fight only those battles that the Lord ordains. When the Lord identifies the enemy that He has given into our hand, then all we have to do is to go through the motion and win the battle, by faith. We fight with the Word of God and we have the victory through Jesus Christ our Lord because He has already defeated the devil.

The pattern of David-versus-Goliath shall repeat again in the last days. The devil is raising up a technological, big brother-type of Goliath while the Lord is raising up a spiritual David to defeat Goliath. The army of Israel that hesitated to engage Goliath in battle is symbolic of religious leaders that knuckle under to the One World Government beast. God has to raise up young, anointed ones to take the

leadership positions of faith in order to achieve victory for the Lord's name sake. It will happen. Let us submit today and allow God to grow our faith!

A few notes of clarification for the reader are necessary. The following Bible pattern consists of three sections:

Section 1 - the first five pages of the pattern contain a two-column format (1st and 2nd witness).

Section 2 - the next thirteen pages have a four-column format due to the complexity of the pattern.

Section 3 - the final three pages revert back to two-column format.

In Section 2, the reader will notice that certain verses from John 6 are enclosed in boxes. The verses immediately under the box, across all four columns, correspond to the verse enclosed in the box. This means a total of <u>five</u> witnesses and the format was used in order to avoid five columns. Take time to study the pattern carefully so that additional revelation may come forth from the Lord.

CHAPTER 10

BAPTISM & BURIAL

This is another of those unusual "reverse" patterns similar to the one from Chapter 35 of the first volume of <u>The Two Witnesses</u>. The complexity of it is just as staggering. Statistically, the pattern is impossible because it represents recorded history. Chronologically, the pattern starts in the upper left corner of the page and progresses counter clockwise until it finishes in the upper right corner of the page. The use of Appendix H, Matthew Mark Luke John, is very important in the study of the pattern because it makes available the four gospels in a harmonized format that makes it easier to understand the chronology of the pattern. The Lord reveals the existence of patterns in order that study of it might be made; so, diligently study the scriptural pattern while referencing Appendix H.

CHAPTER 11

EXODUS 14 - MATTHEW 8 - JONAH

This chapter illustrates a match-up between Exodus 14 and Matthew 8, which has already been covered in Chapter 14 of the first volume of <u>The Two Witnesses</u>. Additionally, this chapter reveals that Exodus 14 and Matthew 8 also match-up with the first half of the book of Jonah! Keep in mind that these books of the Bible actually represent recorded history, and for recorded history to match in such exact patterns is statistically impossible. This point is made repeatedly in each volume of <u>The Two Witnesses</u> in order to strongly impress upon the reader that God is completely in control of past, present, and future.

"Daniel answered and said, Blessed be the name of God for ever and ever: for wisdom and might are his: And he changeth the times and the seasons: he removeth kings, and setteth up kings: he giveth wisdom unto the wise, and knowledge to them that know understanding: He revealeth the deep and secret things: he knoweth what *is* in the darkness, and the light dwelleth with him." Daniel 2:20-22

After studying this chapter, the reader can attempt to contemplate questions which are essentially without answers; such as: "What if Jonah had decided not to flee Nineveh?" or "What if Jonah had perished when he was thrown overboard?" The contemplation of such things is not as beneficial to us as is the contemplation of God's Word for our own life:

"Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God, and keep his commandments: for this *is* the whole *duty* of man." Ecclesiastes 12:13

"Thus saith the LORD, thy Redeemer, the Holy One of Israel; I *am* the LORD thy God which teacheth thee to profit, which leadeth thee by the way *that* thou shouldest go. O that thou hadst hearkened to my commandments! then had thy peace been as a river, and thy righteousness as the waves of the sea: Thy seed also had been as the sand, and the offspring of thy bowels like the gravel thereof; his name should not have been cut off nor destroyed from before me." JONAH & JESUS

This Bible pattern was first presented by Gene Faulstich, on the parallel between the lives of Jonah and Jesus during their trials. It is another example of history repeating itself, but according to God's order and not coincidence.

The big picture is that God ordained a trial by fire for Jonah and for Jesus in order to accomplish His work on the earth. God wanted to save the souls of Nineveh by his prophet Jonah and God wanted to save the souls of mankind from their sins by his son Jesus.

Each one was completely dependent upon God in order to accomplish their mission. Jonah had an attitude problem with anger because he was trying to take ownership of the result of his prophetic word. Jonah fully expected to see judgment rain down upon Nineveh because of "his" prophecy. God's intent was to save these souls and it was God's business what the result of the prophecy was going to be, and not Jonah's business.

"He hath showed thee, O man, what *is* good; and what doth the LORD require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?" Micah 6:8

Jonah had an apparent anger issue, evident when "his" prophecy would not be coming to pass. The Lord's prophecy did come to pass 40 years later.

Jonah was so concerned for his reputation as a prophet, that he would rather die than see "his" prophecy not come to pass.

God would prefer his attitude to be self-sacrificial and merciful so that Jonah would want to see the souls of Nineveh saved at the expense of his reputation as a prophet.

Discernment: the gentiles came unto the knowledge of salvation without knowing the law or the prophets.

HELL

Luke 16, verses 19-31, is considered to be one of the most descriptive sections of the Bible concerning the place called hell and what it is like there. Using the Infinity Bible Code, more information can be obtained about the characteristics of hell.

Recall that:

OT = Old Testament, with 39 books and 929 chapters NT = New Testament, with 27 books and 260 chapters

Some of the Bible chapters that match up with Luke 16 are as follows:

60 th chapter of NT	= Luke 16
60 th chapter of OT	= Exodus 10
60 + 260	= 2 Kings 7, 320 th chapter of OT
0 + 260x2	= Psalm 42, 520 th chapter of OT
60 + 260x3	= Ezekiel 38, 840 th chapter of OT

Additional Bible chapters with multiples of 60 can be researched for even more information. In the two pages following, the five chapters above are tabulated and have key words underlined to show pattern matches and to show details such as the types of torment that take place. May this information be of use to whoever is in need of extra motivation in order to flee from temptation and to walk in love and forgiveness!

The Hebrew phonetic spelling for Lucifer is "HYLL" (pronounced heylel) and is believed to be the etymological origin of the word "hell". The numerical value of HYLL is 75. Another Hebrew word that has a value of 75 is "NAKAH". It means to smite, beat, kill, slaughter. There is at least one example in the New Testament where the context of Lucifer / kill is used in the same verse. In John 8:44a, Jesus said "Ye are of *your* father the <u>devil</u>, and the lusts of your father ye will do. He was a <u>murderer</u> from the beginning..."

The Hebrew word for hell in the Old Testament is pronounced "shehole" (Strong's 7585) and it means hades / world of the dead / grave / hell / pit. From this word is the origin of the English word Sheole and it means the underworld place of hell. A Greek word used for hell in the New Testament is pronounced "hades" (Strong's 86) and it means grave / hell. Another Greek word is "gehenna" (Strong's 1067) and it is in reference to the valley of Hinnom or Ge-Hinnom which is a valley in Jerusalem. It means the place of everlasting punishment / hell.

There is a third Greek word used for hell in the New Testament pronounced "tartaroo" (Strong's 5020) and it means to incarcerate in eternal torment or to cast down to hell. It comes from the word "Tartaros" meaning the deepest abyss of hades. Tartaroo is used only one time in the New Testament:

"For if God spared not the angels that sinned, but cast *them* down to <u>hell</u>, and delivered *them* into chains of darkness, to be reserved unto judgment;" 2 Peter 2:4

This is very similar to the following verse and is likely in reference to the same thing:

"And the angels which kept not their first estate, but left their own habitation, he hath reserved in everlasting chains under darkness unto the judgment of the great day." Jude 1:6

The term "bottomless pit" is found seven times in the book of Revelation and is very likely in reference to tartaroo. The Greek word for bottomless is pronounced "abussos" (Strong's 12) and it can also mean depthless / abyss / deep / pit.

EZEKIEL 38:

REVIVAL

What an amazing Bible pattern between the story of Jonah and the parable of the prodigal son, to help us understand what revival is! For more study on the subject, Charles Finney's preaching on revival is highly recommended.

Whether it is running away from the calling of the Lord or chasing after the things of the world, you discover how much risk and danger there is in rebellion and riotous living. To top if off, you are rejected by sinners because you have fled from the presence of the Lord.

You arrive at the point of desolation and poverty in your life so then you begin serving the world and it swallows you up as one of its many slaves. There appears to be no escape and you feel like a nobody. You got so busy fulfilling your physical appetite that you were rewarded with spiritual famine and then physical famine.

You come to your senses with the revelation that you are a child of God and the purpose of this dead end was not your final destiny but to help you realize what your true priority and purpose is. So then you call out to the Lord in prayer, and with determination you decide to serve the Lord the rest of your days no matter what because you know He will take care of you.

You approach the Lord with all lowliness, humility, and repentance and that's when He pours out his grace, mercy, and love upon you and throws a celebration. Afterwards, you wonder why you ever left Him in the first place?

"Wilt thou not revive us again: that thy people may rejoice in thee?" Psalm 85:6

JONAH 1:

¹Now the word of the LORD came unto Jonah the <u>son</u> of Amittai, saying,

²Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and cry against it; for their wickedness is come up before me.

EXODUS & THE FEASTS

The following pattern reveals a match between the story of Moses in Exodus and the seven feasts of the Lord. The seven feasts are also a pattern for a Christian's life. Life is short so the message from the Bible continues to emphasize that the focus should be on Jesus:

"For to me to live *is* Christ, and to die *is* gain." Phillipians 1:21

In studying this pattern, there is a possible illustration of how the last Pope is established as the global religious leader. Per Exodus, Moses went "up" after the Red Sea crossing; then the image came forth. The last Pope, in the position of Aaron the high priest, has to be in place prior to the image being revealed.

1ST WITNESS (EXODUS)

Ch. 12-14: The first Passover. Moses leads Israel through the Red Sea. Israel is delivered by the LORD.

Ch. 15: Song of Moses.

Ch. 16: People murmur about thirst & hunger. (famine) Manna from heaven.

Ch. 17: Water out of the rock. Fight against Amalek. Moses' hands supported.

Ch. 18: Jethro advises Moses about judging.

Ch. 19: Smoke of God's glory on the mountain.

Ch. 20: Ten commandments given orally and the people tremble. The whole mount quaked greatly.

Ch. 21-23: Details of the judgments.

Ch. 24: The elders see God. The LORD tells Moses about the tables of stone and invites him to go up, 40 days / 40 nights.

Ch. 25: Ark of the Covenant assembly instructions.

Ch. 26: Tabernacle assembly instructions.

Ch. 27: Tabernacle furniture & outer court instructions.

Ch. 28: Aaron's priest office established (instructions).

- Ch. 29: Consecration of the priests (instructions). (the word "mitre") Instructions on sacrifice.
- Ch. 30: Altar and washing instructions.

Ch. 31: Tabernacle craftsmen and Sabbath instructions.

Moses receives original set of tables of stone.

Ch. 32: The people get tired of waiting on Moses and make a golden calf with Aaron's help (Up, make us gods). Moses appears, breaks the tables, destroys the golden calf.

> Who is on the LORD's side? Levites execute judgment. Moses intercedes.

2ND WITNESS (FEASTs of the LORD)

1. PASSOVER

(The old person that the Christian used to be is symbolically buried by water baptism. Salvation by faith rewards the believer with the presence of the Holy Spirit in their "heart".)

2. UNLEAVENED BREAD

(The believer begins to eat the Word of God.)

3. FIRST FRUITS

(The believer begins to live as a new person, speaking the Word in faith and showing signs of charity and godliness.)

4. PENTECOST

(The believer experiences the baptism of the Holy Spirit and with this power the believer shakes the world.)

5. BLOWING OF TRUMPETS

(The believer gets the "wake-up call" that the Lord is returning for him.)

6. DAY OF ATONEMENT

(Final preparations by the believer in order to focus on the Lord's return.)

EXODUS & THE FEASTS

1ST WITNESS (EXODUS)

33: Moses moves the tabernacle away from the camp, cloudy pillar at tabernacle is sign for worship, every man in his tent door.

The LORD's glory revealed to Moses.

34: Moses invited up again to the mount to see the Lord's glory again and to receive the replacement tables of stone.

Feast instructions. On the mount for 40 days / 40 nights. Moses' face shines.

35: Moses instructs Israel on Sabbath and offerings.

36: Moses instructs Israel on service of the

- sanctuary and assembly thereof.
- 37: "tabernacle furniture.
- 38: " tabernacle.
- 39: " priestly vestments.

40: Tabernacle reared up. Ark of the Covenant brought in. LORD's glory fills the tabernacle. 7. FEAST OF TABERNACLES (Full communion with the Lord and full maturity by the believer.)

2ND WITNESS (FEASTs of the LORD)

DISCIPLESHIP

The reason the Bible was written is so that we can know the truth, by reading, studying, and believing what is written in the Bible. Some people might think: "if Jesus were here, I would hang out with him all day long." If they don't read their Bible, neither would they "hang out" with Jesus.

John 8:31 tells us that reading the Word of God is the same as being taught or discipled by Jesus. In verses John 1:1 and John 1:14 it says that Jesus is the Word. The following pattern is conclusive on that.

There is major benefit in deep study of the Bible (Jeremiah 33:3). Increased revelation of the Word is a sign of deeper communion with Jesus.

DISCIPLESHIP

1ST WITNESS

MATTHEW 4:

¹⁸And Jesus, walking by the sea of Galilee, saw two brethren, Simon called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea: for they were fishers.

THE LORD'S PRAYER AND THE DOCTRINE OF CHRIST

s it any surprise that the pattern of the Lord's prayer is a direct match with the doctrine of the principles of Christ in Hebrews 6:1-3? IT IS AN ILLUSTRATION OF WHAT OUR CHRISTIAN LIFESTYLE IS SUPPOSED TO BE.

A person receives the born again salvation experience when they confess and believe that Jesus is their Lord. (Romans 10:9-10, Acts 8:36-38. Luke 23:42-43) They become a new creation in Christ and are no longer the servant of sin (2 Corinthians 5:17, Romans 6:17-18). The old person that they used to be is buried spiritually by water baptism as a sign of repentance from the old lifestyle and a type of deliverance from evil takes place from tormenting spirits of the past. Water baptism is important because it signifies we have departed the old lifestyle forever, by choice.

The baptism of the Holy Spirit gives the believer power to overcome temptation and to not commit sin. (1 John 3:9,24; 5:18, Luke 11:13). The baptism of fire helps a person learn obedience by the things that they suffer for Christ (Matthew 3:11-12, Hebrews 5:8, 1 Peter 4:19).

John the Baptist conducted physical baptisms and Jesus conducts spiritual baptisms. This is the reason that Jesus did not perform water baptisms, only His disciples did (John 4:1-2). Jesus did not prepare the way for John's ministry but John prepared the way for Jesus (Matthew 3:1-3). Jesus does not emphasize the physical, He emphasizes the spiritual. The people were focused on physical bread and Jesus wanted them to focus on spiritual bread (John 6:63). Some denominations today focus on physical baptism and Jesus wants the focus on spiritual baptism. Has the person's heart been changed? It can only be accomplished spiritually.

John used water for baptism and Jesus uses spiritual water, which is the Holy Spirit. The Word is given and the Holy Spirit follows (Acts 1:4-5, Mark 16:15-18). Some denominations say that a person must be water baptized in order to have salvation, but this makes of none effect the blood of Jesus. Only by the shedding of Christ's blood is the remission of sin (Hebrews 9:22, 12-14, 1 John 1:7). God's grace is a gift to us so that we may have salvation (Ephesians 2:8-9, Romans 5:15-18).

Some denominations focus on water baptism and salvation and grow no further because they do not graduate to the focus on spiritual baptism. Thus, you do not see the gifts of the Holy Spirit operating in their churches, because of immaturity and unbelief (1 Corinthians 12, 14). With the gifts, there also needs to be the fruit of the Holy Spirit taking place (1 Corinthians 13, Galatians 5:22-23). Jesus said we shall know His real disciples by their fruits (Matthew 7:15-20, John 15:4-5). If there is only the gifts operating, then there is the possibility of the antichrist spirit of religion coming in and infiltrating the church. The gifts will then give way to an old wineskin of religion that puts its congregation back under the law of works and unbelief (bondage). The church eventually shrivels away and dies from thirst for living water.

In summary, a believer shows spiritual growth in the following sequence:

- 1. Salvation by grace because of the belief that Jesus is their personal Lord and Savior.
- 2. The person is now a new creation in Christ with more freedom and peace.
- 3. Baptism of water spiritually buries the old person, no more condemnation and guilt.
- 4. Baptism of the Holy Spirit gives power over sin, learns how to forgive completely.
- 5. Gifts of the Holy Spirit begin to operate, fruit of the Holy Spirit grows, shows more love.
- 6. Baptism of fire in order to learn obedience to the Lord and to grow in faith.
- 7. Maturity in the gifts and fruit of the Holy Spirit, walking in unconditional love and forgiveness, constant in joy through trials and tribulations, fully trusts in the Lord, miracle signs and wonders following the Word, generously gives and graciously receives.

It is written in the

prophets. And they shall be all taught of God. Every man therefore that hath heard, and hath learned of the Father, cometh unto me. Not that any man hath seen the Father, save he which is of God, he hath seen the Father. Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that believeth on me hath everlasting life. I am that bread of life. Your fathers did eat manna in the wilderness, and are dead. This is the bread which cometh down from heaven, that a man may eat thereof, and not die. I am the living bread which came down from heaven: if any man eat of this bread, he shall live for ever: and the bread that I will give is my flesh, which I will give for the life of the world. The Jews therefore strove among themselves, saying, How can this man give us his flesh to eat? Then Jesus said unto them, Verily, verily, I say unto you, Except ye eat the flesh of the Son of man, and drink his blood, ye have no life in you. (Live works = <u>believing</u> in and pursuing the Lord Jesus; the reward is <u>forgiveness</u> of sin and eternal life.)

And now also the axe is laid unto the root of the trees: therefore every tree which bringeth not forth good fruit is hewn down, and cast into the fire. I indeed <u>baptize you with water</u> unto repentance: but he that cometh after me is mightier than I. whose shoes I am not worthy to bear: he shall baptize you with the Holy Ghost, and with fire: Whose fan is in his hand, and he will thoroughly purge his floor, and gather his wheat into the garner; but he will burn up the chaff with unquenchable fire." (Nazareth – from the Hebrew word "Nazar" meaning to consecrate or separate oneself, and "eth" meaning season or time.)

(To some degree, <u>water baptism</u> will result in <u>deliverance</u> from tormenting spirits, as typified by <u>Pharaoh's army</u>.) 2ND WITNESS

HEBREWS 6:

¹...of <u>repentance</u> from dead works, and of <u>faith</u> toward God,

MICAH 5 & JEREMIAH 5

While sitting in the backyard one evening and looking up at the sky, the Lord put it into the author's heart to review these two Bible chapters for a pattern. It happened just like that: out of the blue.

In studying the "Jeremiah 5" column, what becomes quickly apparent is that the subject matter concerns the judgment of Israel. Whenever we see "Israel" in this context, we can also substitute "spiritual Israel" or "the Church" in its place. Both "Israel" and "spiritual Israel" can apply here.

"For the time *is come* that judgment must begin at the house of God: and if *it* first *begin* at us, what shall the end *be* of them that obey not the gospel of God?" 1 Peter 4:17

The subject matter of the "Micah 5" column is very intriguing. Verse two is the prophecy concerning the birth of Jesus in Bethlehem. The remainder of the chapter concerns Israel in the last days. It appears that during the period of tribulation and the invasion of Israel, the Lord brings forth a remnant "through the fire". He will use this remnant to execute judgment upon the enemies of Israel; namely, the land of Assyria and the land of Nimrod. This area of the Middle East is primarily composed of Islamic Arabs. There is the specific mention of seven shepherds and eight principal men (verse five) in the leadership of the remnant. It is possible that this remnant is associated with the 144,000.

MICAH 5:

¹Now gather thyself in troops, O daughter of troops: he hath laid siege against us: they shall smite the judge of Israel

...with a rod upon the cheek.

²But thou, Bethlehem Ephratah*, <u>though thou be little</u> among the thousands of Judah,

...yet out of thee shall he come forth unto me *that is* to be <u>ruler in Israel</u>; whose goings forth *have been* from of old, from everlasting.

³Therefore will he give them up, until <u>the time *that* she</u> <u>which travaileth</u> hath brought forth:

...then the remnant of his brethren shall return unto the children of Israel.

(*Ephratah = Strong's 672, another name for Bethlehem. Ref. 1 Chron. 4:4 – father of Bethlehem)

⁵And this *man* shall be the peace, when <u>the Assyrian</u> <u>shall come into our land</u>:

and when <u>he shall tread in our palaces</u>, then shall we raise against him seven shepherds, and eight principal men.

⁶And they shall waste the land of Assyria with the sword, and the land of Nimrod in the entrances thereof: <u>thus shall he deliver *us* from the Assyrian</u>, when he cometh into our land, and when he treadeth within our borders.

⁷And <u>the remnant of Jacob shall be in the midst of</u> <u>many people</u> as a dew from the LORD, as the showers upon the grass, that tarrieth not for man, nor waiteth for the sons of men.

MICAH 5: ⁸And the remnant of Jacob

...shall be among the Gentiles in the midst of many people as a lion among the beasts of the forest, as a young lion among the flocks of sheep: who, if he go through, both treadeth down, and teareth in pieces, and none can deliver.

⁹Thine hand shall be lifted up upon thine adversaries, and all thine enemies shall be cut off.

¹⁰And it shall come to pass in that day, saith the LORD, that I will cut off thy horses out of the midst of thee, and I will destroy thy chariots:

¹¹And I will cut off the cities of thy land, and throw down all thy strong holds:

²And I will cut off witchcrafts out of thine hand; and thou shalt have no more soothsayers:

¹³Thy graven images also will I cut off, and thy standing images out of the midst of thee; and thou shalt no more worship the work of thine hands.

¹⁴And I will pluck up thy groves out of the midst of thee: so will I destroy thy cities.

¹⁵And I will execute vengeance in anger and fury upon the heathen, such as they have not heard.

²²Fear ve not me? saith the LORD: will ye not tremble at my presence, which have placed the sand for the bound of the sea by a perpetual decree, that it cannot pass it: and though the waves thereof toss themselves, yet can they not prevail; though they

roar, yet can they not pass over it?

²³But this people hath a revolting and a rebellious heart; they are revolted and gone.

²⁴Neither sav they in their heart, Let us now fear the LORD our God, that giveth rain, both the former and the latter, in his season: he reserveth unto us the

appointed weeks of the harvest. ²⁵Your iniquities have turned away these *things*, and your sins have withholden good *things* from you. ²⁶For <u>among my people</u> are found wicked *men*:

they lay wait, as he that setteth snares; they set a trap, they catch men.

²⁷As a cage is full of birds, so *are* their houses full of deceit: therefore they are become great, and waxen rich.

²⁸They are waxen fat, they shine: yea, they overpass the deeds of the wicked: they judge not the cause, the cause of the fatherless, yet they prosper; and the right of the needy do they not judge.

²⁹Shall I not visit for these *things*? saith the LORD:

^{...}shall not my soul be avenged on such a nation as this?

³⁰A wonderful and horrible thing is committed in the land:

³¹The prophets prophesy falsely, and the priests bear rule by their means; and my people love to have it so: and what will ye do in the end thereof?

REVELATION 5 & REVELATION 10

The pattern match-up between the two Bible chapters Revelation 5 and 10, reveals that the Book of Revelation is God's title deed to the earth. This correlates with Psalm 24; specifically, the first verse:

¹The earth *is* the LORD'S, and the fulness thereof; the world, and they that dwell therein.

²For he hath founded it upon the seas, and established it upon the floods.

³Who shall ascend into the hill of the LORD? or who shall stand in his holy place?

⁴He that hath clean hands, and a pure heart; who hath not lifted up his soul unto vanity, nor sworn deceitfully.

⁵He shall receive the blessing from the LORD, and righteousness from the God of his salvation.

⁶This *is* the generation of them that seek him, that seek thy face, O Jacob. *Selah*

⁷Lift up your heads, O ye gates; and be ye lift up, ye everlasting doors; and the King of glory shall come in.

⁸Who *is* this King of glory? The LORD strong and mighty, the LORD mighty in battle.

⁹Lift up your heads, O ye gates; even lift *them* up, ye everlasting doors; and the King of glory shall come in.

¹⁰Who is this King of glory? The LORD of hosts, he *is* the King of glory. Selah

The entire Psalm 24 is included here because it illustrates additional insight concerning the pattern in Revelation 5 and 10.

Revelation 5:2 asks: "Who is worthy to open the book, and to loose the seals thereof?"

Revelation 5:5 says that "the Lion of the tribe of Juda" opens the book because He has "prevailed". How did Jesus prevail? His sacrifice at the cross is how He prevailed. Psalm 24 illustrates this in detail because it shows the victory of his resurrection. Psalms 22, 23, and 24 are prophetic and are about Jesus:

Psalm 22:His crucifixion.Psalm 23:His death.Psalm 24:His resurrection.

The Book of Revelation is "sealed" until the time of the end (Rev. 10:4). As Jesus begins unsealing the book in the last days, the trial, death, and resurrection of the Body of Christ occur (Great Tribulation); at the end of which, Jesus takes possession of the earth. Then an amazing thing happens. Jesus gives the book to His servants because "(Jesus) hast made us unto our God kings and priests: and we shall reign on the earth." This inheritance is so awesome that it is incomprehensible with the carnal mind.

One final note; even though the seven thunders are part of the pattern, they remain sealed.

³And no man in heaven, nor in earth, neither under the earth, was able to open the book, neither to look thereon.

...and to loose the seven seals thereof.

...the four beasts and <u>four and twenty elders</u> fell down before the Lamb, having every one of them harps, and golden vials full of odours, which are the prayers of saints.

³And cried with <u>a loud voice</u>,

...as *when* a <u>lion</u> roareth: and when he had cried, seven thunders uttered their voices.

⁴And when the seven thunders had uttered their voices, I was about to write: and I heard a voice from heaven saying unto me, <u>Seal up those things</u> which the seven thunders uttered, and write them not.

⁵And <u>the angel which I saw</u> stand upon the sea and upon the earth lifted up his hand to heaven,

⁶And sware by <u>him that liveth for ever and ever</u>, who created heaven, and the things that therein are, and <u>the earth</u>, and the things that therein are, and the sea, and the things which are therein, that there should be time no longer:

The pattern match-up between Exodus 19-20 and Revelation 4-5 is a contrast of two lifestyles or two mindsets.

Exodus 19-20 is for the immature person who focuses on the physical aspect of life and consequently, is focused on keeping the law and is limited to present reality. His relationship with God is somewhat distant and fearful of judgment.

Revelation 4-5 is an illustration of the lifestyle of the mature believer who prefers the spiritual existence of living a life for God, according to the leading of the Holy Spirit, and is rewarded with the revelation of who God is and what the future brings. Thus, they not only live in a present reality but in a past and future dimension, which is more like the Lord: who was, and is, and is to come; the Alpha and the Omega; the first and the last. There is no time in the spirit world.

The comparison of the glory of the Lord is similar because it represents the One who is the same yesterday, today, and forever.

CHAPTER 21

EXODUS - REVELATION PLAGUES & JESUS

The following Bible pattern is really quite amazing. To see the spiritual big picture is at the pinnacle of revelation of the deeper things of God. The pattern illustrates a match-up between three Bible events:

- the plagues of judgment from the book of Exodus,
- the plagues of judgment from the book of Revelation,
- the sequence of events from the gospels of the betrayal, crucifixion, death, and resurrection of Jesus

The seven plagues of Revelation have their counterparts with most of the ten plagues of Exodus. Several plagues of Exodus have no apparent counterparts with Revelation but the pattern match-up with the gospels reveals the deeper meaning of these plagues. (Refer also to Chapter 41 of the first volume of The Two Witnesses) Below is a table summary of the match-up.

An ominous revelation is that the king of the chief priests of the temple is the fallen angel Abaddon / Apolloyon.

Jesus was crucified, garments parted, buried, resurrected, ascended, and afterwards came Pentecost for the 120 of the upper room and for others. Israel will be crucified, plundered, buried, resurrected, and ascended with a latter-rain Pentecost for the 144,000 (12x12x1000) and for others!

The next two pages contain a table illustrating the comparisons of the plagues, followed by eleven pages of the Bible pattern for the Exodus-Revelation-Gospels scriptures.

This pattern, as with most, provides a deeper revelation of who Jesus is spiritually. Ultimate revelation is to know God, which appropriately is the subject of the last chapter (pinnacle) of the book of Revelation.

CHAPTER 22

CANDLESTICK & TWO TREES

The title of this chapter, "Candlestick & Two Trees", is a reference to the title of this book, <u>The Two</u> <u>Witnesses</u>, which is also a reference to Zechariah 4:2-3 with the golden candlestick and an olive tree on either side of it. What meaneth all this?

The last three pages of the following Bible pattern compares three chapters: Exodus 25, Matthew 17, and Zechariah 4. The identity of the two olive trees of Zechariah 4 compares with Moses and Elijah (the law and the prophets), and it also compares with the two cherubs on either side of the mercy seat of the ark of the covenant. The candlestick of gold and the mercy seat of gold compare with Jesus. "Grace, grace" in Zechariah 4 compares with Jesus rising from the dead. There are other comparisons in this pattern, and each one provides additional confirmation that Jesus is the Messiah and that he is who he says he is, the great I AM.

The first five pages of the following Bible pattern compares three chapters: Exodus 17, Luke 23, and Luke 19. Exodus 17 is the 67th chapter of the Old Testament and Luke 23 is the 67th chapter of the New Testament, so there should be matching subject matter in both chapters. Luke 19 provides additional matching scriptures also. The smiting of the rock of Horeb compares with Jesus being crucified. The water that comes out of the rock to quench the people's thirst compares with the blood covenant through Jesus that permits the quenching of spiritual thirst by the living water of the Holy Spirit. Aaron and Hur on either side of Moses compares with the two malefactors on either side of Jesus on the cross. At the going down of the sun/Son, victory was won. There are additional details in the comparisons for study.

There will be a future fulfillment of this pattern by what the people of God go through in the last days.

CHAPTER 23

THE LIVING TEMPLE

The prophecy of Jesus concerning the last days is a direct match with the events concerning the last supper and the betrayal of Jesus. The last supper and betrayal is additional information in order for the Christian to know how the last days are going to play out.

After an exchange of money, Jesus was to be killed. Because of a paycheck or a promise of money, false Christians will betray true Christians to the religious leadership and then be turned over to the governmental order for execution. The true Christians represent the living temple of stones to be eventually thrown down.

Before this takes place, God will be drawing His people close together spiritually while the rest of the people in the world will be fighting against each other in wars and ethnic battles. There will also be false Christs and false religions calling for people to follow them but the Holy Spirit will draw the true Christians together however He will and there will be fellowship with the Lord and with each other.

Afterwards, true Christians will each be in their own spiritual garden praying earnestly right before persecution take its full course. The sign will be when armies are surrounding Jerusalem / Israel. It is important to pray that ye enter not into temptation, before the sign appears!

Eventually there is a great earthquake and a resurrection around the time of the Feast of Passover in the spring and chaos will usher in. The antichrist shortly after makes his appearance.

CHAPTER 24

THE 6 SEALS & REVELATION 19-20

In the Bible pattern that follows, the columns of Revelation 6 and Matthew 24 represent the tribulation of the last days and the rise of the kingdom of the antichrist. Revelation 19 and 20 represent the end of the tribulation with the downfall of the antichrist and the reign of the kingdom of Jesus Christ. The antichrist false Messiah makes his appearance 3 ½ years before the true Messiah Jesus returns.

There will be a false Second Coming midway through the 5th seal of Revelation 6, which is 3 ½ years before the real Second Coming of Jesus. It will start with a period of deception, wars, famines, plagues, and persecution. Then World War III will begin with an attack and overthrow of the United States (judgment), followed by a short intense global battle which results in a truce and the formation of world government with the appearance of the false Messiah in such a way that it appears to be the Second Coming. Once the antichrist false Messiah appears, the great deception is in place and salvation will no longer be possible for people who are unsaved.

It is important to understand in the following pattern that Revelation 6/Matthew 24 match up with Revelation 19/20 because their pattern of events match. However, Revelation 6/Matthew 24 takes place chronologically before Revelation 19/20 does.

Refer to Appendix E for a detailed study of the book of Revelation's chronological order of events.

CRUCIFIXION & THE 6 SEALS OF REVELATION 6

Revelation Chapter 6 is a summary of what happens in the last days, much like Matthew Chapter 24, Mark Chapter 13, and Luke Chapters 17 and 21. This is explained in Chapter 33 of the first volume of <u>The Two Witnesses</u>. Revelation 6 is also a summary of most of the book of Revelation, up to the point where God's wrath is poured out (the Day of the Lord), then Revelation 6 stops there. In Revelation 6 there are the famous "four horses of the apocalypse": white, red, black, and pale. The Infinity Bible Code teaches that similarly-numbered Bible chapters and books will have the same content. The four horses are also found in Zechariah 6:

^{"1}And I turned, and lifted up mine eyes, and looked, and, behold, there came four chariots out from between two mountains; and the mountains *were* mountains of brass.

²In the first chariot were red horses; and in the second chariot black horses;

³And in the third chariot white horses; and in the fourth chariot grisled and bay horses.

⁴Then I answered and said unto the angel that talked with me, What are these, my lord?

⁵And the angel answered and said unto me, These *are* the four spirits of the heavens, which go forth from standing before the Lord of all the earth.

⁶The black horses which *are* therein go forth into the north country; and the white go forth after them; and the grisled go forth toward the south country.

⁷And the bay went forth, and sought to go that they might walk to and fro through the earth: and he said, Get you hence, walk to and fro through the earth. So they walked to and fro through the earth.

We know that the Bible illustrates cycles of events that repeat throughout time, in a matching pattern. So, the pattern of what happened in the past will be the pattern of what happens in the future. What will happen in the future has already happened in the past. Even though Revelation 6 is what will happen in the last days, its pattern has already taken place one or more times in the past. When studying the following match-up between the gospel of Matthew and Revelation 6, what is revealed is that the pattern of Revelation 6 shows that the last days of Jesus match the last days of the Church.

Thus, Revelation 6 is a summary of the last days of God's people. The things that Jesus went through will be the things that God's people go through, according to the six page Bible pattern that follows. The Church will be tried by fire in the last days when Seal 1 through Seal 5 are opened. Jesus was betrayed by religious leadership and so too will the Church be betrayed by religious leadership. Seal 6 is the sign that the wrath of God (Day of the Lord) is soon to come upon the devil's kingdom, and that is when the people of the world will be hiding in the earth while God's martyred people will be resurrected out of the earth.

"Then said Jesus unto his disciples, If any *man* will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow me. For whosoever will save his life shall lose it: and whosoever will lose his life for my sake shall find it." Matthew 16:24-25

DESCENT FROM THE MOUNT

This chapter discusses some of the deeper revelations of the Word. It is up to the reader to take this information before the Lord in prayerful meditation, since it may be too much to absorb at first.

Consider the following verses:

"For as Jonas was three days and three nights in the whale's belly; so shall the Son of man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth." Matthew 12:40

"Wherefore he saith, When he ascended up on high, he led captivity captive, and gave gifts unto men. (Now that he ascended, what is it but that he also descended first into the lower parts of the earth? He that descended is the same also that ascended up far above all heavens, that he might fill all things.)" Ephesians 4:8-10

"For Christ also hath once suffered for sins, the just for the unjust, that he might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh, but quickened by the Spirit: By which also he went and preached unto the spirits in prison;" 1 Peter 3:18-19

"He seeing this before spake of the resurrection of Christ, that his soul was not left in hell, neither his flesh did see corruption." Acts 2:31

"I *am* he that liveth, and was dead; and, behold, I am alive for evermore, Amen; and have the keys of hell and of death." Revelation 1:18

We know from these verses, and from others, that after Jesus died on the cross, He was three days and three nights in the heart of the earth, then He was resurrected. We also know from these verses that the place called "hell" is somewhere inside the earth. Consider also, the following:

"And it came to pass, that the beggar died, and was carried by the angels into Abraham's bosom: the rich man also died, and was buried; And in hell he lift up his eyes, being in torments, and seeth Abraham afar off, and Lazarus in his bosom. And he cried and said, Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus, that he may dip the tip of his finger in water, and cool my tongue; for I am tormented in this flame. But Abraham said, Son, remember that thou in thy lifetime receivedst thy good things, and likewise Lazarus evil things: but now he is comforted, and thou art tormented. And beside all this, between us and you there is a great gulf fixed: so that they which would pass from hence to you cannot; neither can they pass to us, that *would come* from thence."

"And he said unto Jesus, Lord, remember me when thou comest into thy kingdom. And Jesus said unto him, Verily I say unto thee, To day shalt thou be with me in paradise."

Luke 23:42-43

The second set of verses tells us that the place called "paradise", or Abraham's bosom, is also inside the earth and that there is a "great gulf" between it and hell. Finally, consider the following:

"The strong among the mighty shall speak to him out of the midst of hell with them that help him: they are gone down, they lie uncircumcised, slain by the sword. Asshur *is* there and all her company: his graves *are* about him: all of them slain, fallen by the sword: Whose graves are set in the sides of the pit, and her company is round about her grave: all of them slain, fallen by the sword, which caused terror in the land of the living. There *is* Elam and all her multitude round about her grave, all of them slain, fallen by the sword, which are gone down uncircumcised into the nether parts of the earth, which caused their terror in the land of the living; yet have they borne their shame with them that go down to the pit."

DESCENT FROM THE MOUNT

"Yet thou shalt be brought down to hell, to the sides of the pit." Isaiah 14:15

The third set of verses reveals that hell is described as "the sides of the pit". The conclusion that can be made about the three sets of verses is as follows. Prior to the resurrection of Jesus, whenever a saint died he would descend into the center of the earth, into a void known as paradise or Abraham's bosom and there he would be comforted. Whenever a person died in their sins, they descended into hell, which is the sides of the pit (the sides of the void). Imagine the earth as a peach without its peach seed. In the middle is a void and around this void is the rough-edged sides of the pit. The people who are damned for eternity are in the sides of the pit and could see the saints in the center void. It would be like someone standing on the ground and looking up toward the clouds. He can attempt to jump as high as possible but can never reach the clouds. Thus, it is impossible to pass from "hence" to "thence".

After the resurrection of Jesus; however, He led "captivity captive" and took the deceased saints with Him to reside in heaven where the Father resides. The result is that there are no longer any saints remaining in the void formerly known as paradise. This void is probably now the "bottomless pit" of Revelation 20:3. When a saint passes away today he goes to be with the Lord, in heaven.

"We are confident, *I say*, and willing rather to be absent from the body, and to be present with the Lord." 2 Corinthians 5:8

Appendix A in the first volume of <u>The Two Witnesses</u> discusses the Feasts of the Lord and explains that the resurrection of Jesus took place on the Feast of First Fruits. The saints were in the inner void of the earth, a type of seed in the ground, and Jesus brought them up with Him as a harvest to present to the Father; a type of waving of the sheaf of the first fruits of the barley harvest.

"...When ye be come into the land which I give unto you, and shall reap the harvest thereof, then ye shall bring a sheaf of the firstfruits of your harvest unto the priest: And he shall wave the sheaf before the LORD, to be accepted for you: on the morrow after the sabbath the priest shall wave it."

Question: so what was Jesus doing in the center of the earth during the three days and three nights? The answer is illustrated in great detail by the following Bible pattern. However, in summary, the answer is that the triumphal entry of Jesus coming down from the Mount of Olives and entering Jerusalem is a match for the death of Jesus on Calvary and his descent into the heart of the earth into paradise. The reader is exhorted to study the scriptural pattern that follows, very carefully. A useful tool in the exploration of the pattern is Appendix G: The Triumphal Entry. Study the scripture of this appendix in order to see what Jesus was saying and doing while in the heart of the earth for three days and nights.

Interestingly, the pattern also shows that of the two thieves on the cross next to Jesus, one was a Gentile and he was the "colt" that Jesus "rode upon" into the place called paradise. When the Gentile thief passed away, Jesus sent two angels to receive the thief into the service of the Lord (Matt. 21:1, Mark 11:1, Luke 19:29).

There have been theories proposed that Jesus was crucified on the Mount of Olives, to the east of Jerusalem. However, this is not biblically consistent. The Bible, along with archaeological evidence, points north of Jerusalem toward Calvary, a.k.a. Golgotha, as the site of the crucifixion. For further discussion, see Appendix B: Bible Archaeology.

⁴⁶And when Jesus had cried with a loud voice, he said, Father, into thy hands I commend my spirit: and having said thus, he gave up the ghost.

(The thief on the cross – next to Jesus the doorway.) (The old way of the law is eclipsed by the new way of grace.)

...that it is time for the resurrection and they are coming with Him.)

ANGELS & ARCHANGELS

There are several types of heavenly beings operating in the spirit world; two of which are angels and archangels. The angels are the "regular" messengers and the archangels are the "chief" messengers. Archangels appear to be responsible for carrying very important messages, such as the archangel Gabriel bringing revelation to Daniel or announcing to Mary that she would be giving birth to Jesus, the Savior of the world. Archangels are also involved in significant spiritual warfare events such as Michael protecting the nation of Israel (Dan. 12:1) and casting the devil out of 2nd heaven (Rev. 12:7-9). The devil has his angels also and they are known as messengers of Satan (2 Corinthians 12:7).

ANGELS

The following information about the word "angel" is from Strong's and Young's biblical concordances:

- Angel = Strong's 4397 (OT): malak (orig. Hebrew), dispatch as a deputy, messenger
 - = Strong's 32 (NT): aggelos (orig. Greek), messenger; from 71 and 34: to bring tidings
 - = Young's: (OT) messenger, agent (malak)
 - = Young's: (NT) messenger, agent (aggelos)
 - = MALAK (Hebrew phonetic spelling)
 - = mem(40) + lamed(30) + aleph(1) + kaph(20)
 - = 91 (example: Psalm 91:11 "For he shall give his angels charge over thee...")

For the reader's clarification, OT and NT refer to "Old Testament" and "New Testament".

One function of angels appears to be the deliverance of God's people (Genesis 19:15-16, Psalm 34:7, Daniel 12:1). Another function is executing God's judgment (Ezekiel 9, Acts 12:22-23). A main function of angels appears to be carrying messages from God to certain people. An example is seen in Genesis Chapter 18 where the LORD appeared to Abraham and he "...lift up his eyes and looked, and, lo, three men stood by him..." The LORD appeared to Abraham in the form of three angels which appeared as men. After they ate with Abraham, they informed him that he and Sarah would have a son. One "man" stayed behind in order for Abraham to intercede to the LORD with while the other two "men" went into Sodom to survey the wickedness before judgment fell. Genesis 19:1 confirms that the two men that went into Sodom were angels. It is this author's belief that the angel who stayed with Abraham was Gabriel.

Scripture says that Abraham was standing before the LORD and that he drew near to Him (Gen. 18:22-23). Abraham appears to have been standing before an angel of the LORD (Gabriel) and that he was not standing before Jesus because Jesus had not yet come in the form of flesh until Mary gave Him birth. Another example of this can be found in Judges Chapter 6:

"And when Gideon perceived that he *was* an angel of the LORD, Gideon said, Alas, O Lord GOD! for because I have seen an angel of the LORD face to face. And the LORD said unto him, Peace *be* unto thee; fear not: thou shalt not die." Judges 6:22-23

However, the Old Testament does refer to Jesus as being seen occasionally in the spirit. For more discussion and specific verses, see the section following on "JESUS".

Angels are typically described as men (Genesis 18), sometimes clothed in linen (Ezekiel 9 & 10, Daniel 10 & 12) or sometimes they are described as men clothed in white and/or being as bright as lightning (Matthew 28:3, Mark 16:5). They are not described as having wings or having the appearance of a woman. The only heavenly beings mentioned with wings are the cherubim and seraphim (Ezekiel 1 & 10, Revelation 4, Isaiah 6). If a person sees an "angel" with wings, they should test the spirits to see whether they are of God (1 John 4:1-3). The devil knows how to deceive people and in 2 Corinthians 11:14-15 it says that the devil can appear as an angel of light and that his ministers pose as ministers of righteousness.

ANGELS & ARCHANGELS

The devil's angels are discussed in Revelation 12 where we read about the future prophecy of the devil and his angels being cast out of 2nd heaven down to 1st heaven (from the spiritual dimension into the physical dimension). For reference, 2nd heaven is the spirit world outside of the throne room of 3rd heaven (Isaiah 66:1, 2 Cor. 12:2, 1 John 5:7) and the atmosphere and the space above earth is 1st heaven. Revelation 12 tells us in verse 4 that a third of the angels are in the devil's kingdom, having fallen from grace after Lucifer sinned and was cast out of 3rd heaven (Isaiah 14, Ezekiel 28, Luke 10:18) and his angels also fell into sin (Genesis 6:2-4, Jude 1:6, 2 Peter 2:4).

By the end of the Bible, the devil will have received three spiritual demotions:

- 1.) as the archangel Lucifer he sinned and was cast out of the throne room of 3rd heaven (Isaiah 14:12),
- 2.) as the devil he will lose in battle to Michael the archangel and be cast out of the spirit world of 2nd heaven and become an "earthling" (Rev. 12:7-90) and the great tribulation starts shortly thereafter,
- 3.) as the defeated enemy he will be cast into the lake of fire and no longer have access to 1st, 2nd, or 3rd heaven (Rev. 20:10). After this, the Lord will make a new heaven and a new earth (Rev. 21:1).

Los Angeles means "the angels" in Spanish. Does Los Angeles represent fallen angels or good angels? If the spiritual fruit of this city is wickedness, then we can presume that it is the city of fallen angels. In the future, Los Angeles will receive its judgment also, even as the devil's angels are destined for theirs.

ARCHANGELS

As stated previously, the archangels are the chief messengers. Consider the following from biblical concordances:

Archangel = Strong's 743 (NT): archaggelos (orig. Greek word) a chief angel; from 757 and 32: to be first, reign over, angel, messenger

= Young's: (NT) chief messenger (archaggelos)

There appears to be only 3 named archangels in the Bible: Gabriel, Michael, and Lucifer. Details of each archangel are presented in the following sections with a brief summary discussion at the end.

GABRIEL

A description of Gabriel the archangel would include words such as "mighty", "great man of God", "captain of God's people", "chief messenger", "presenter of prophetic revelation knowledge and understanding", "one who stands in the presence of God offering the prayers of the saints", and "messenger of glad tidings".

Here is the Infinity Bible Code methodology for Gabriel's number and its corresponding verses:

- Gabriel = Strong's 1403 (OT): man of God, an archangel; from 1397 and 410: mighty, valiant, great, power, strong
 - = Strong's 1043 (NT): an archangel
 - = Young's: "God is mighty". A divine messenger sent to Daniel, Mary, & Zecharias
 - = GBRYAL (Hebrew phonetic spelling)
 - = gimmel(3) + beth(2) + resh(200) + yod(10) + aleph(1) + lamed(30)
 - = be great, mighty (Gabar, 205) + yod(10) + God, god, great, mighty (EI, 31)
 - = 246
 - = 1 Samuel 10 (246th chapter of OT)
 - = Revelation 8 $(246^{th} \text{ chapter of NT})$

Following are selected verses from 1 Samuel 10 and Revelation 8, the chapters for Gabriel the archangel, and what is revealed are the attributes of Gabriel or the identity of Gabriel:

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"Then Samuel took a vial of oil, and poured *it* upon his head, and kissed him, and said, *Is it* not because the LORD hath anointed thee *to be* <u>captain over his inheritance</u>?" 1 Samuel 10:1

"And they ran and fetched him thence: and when he stood among the people, <u>he was higher than any of</u> <u>the people</u> from his shoulders and upward. And Samuel said to all the people, See ye <u>him whom the</u> <u>LORD hath chosen</u>, that <u>there is none like him</u> among all the people? And all the people shouted, and said, God save the king." 1 Samuel 10:23-24

"And <u>another angel</u> came and stood at the altar, having a golden censer; and there was given unto him much incense, that he should offer *it* with the prayers of all saints upon the golden altar which was before the throne." Revelation 8:3

MICHAEL

A description of Michael the archangel would include words such as "powerful", "who is like God?", "the prince of the people of Israel", "holy one of God", "captain of the hosts of the LORD", "wielder of the sword", "executioner of the Lord's judgment", and "angel of the Lord's glory and resurrection power".

Here is the Infinity Bible Code methodology for Michael's number and its corresponding verses:

"And at that time shall <u>Michael</u> stand up, <u>the great prince</u> which standeth for the children of thy people: and there shall be a time of trouble, such as never was since there was a nation *even* to that same time: and at that time thy people shall be delivered, every one that shall be found written in the book." Daniel 12:1

"Yet <u>Michael the archangel</u>, when contending with the devil he disputed about the body of Moses, durst not bring against him a railing accusation, but said, The Lord rebuke thee." Jude 1:9

"And there was war in heaven: <u>Michael</u> and his angels fought against the dragon; and the dragon fought and his angels, And prevailed not; neither was their place found any more in heaven. And the great dragon was cast out, that old serpent, called the Devil, and Satan, which deceiveth the whole world: he was cast out into the earth, and his angels were cast out with him." Revelation 12:7-9

"And the LORD sent <u>an angel</u>, which <u>cut off</u> all the mighty men of valour, and the leaders and captains in the camp of the king of Assyria (*2 Kings 19:35 the angel of the LORD slew 185,000 Assyrians*). LUCIFER

A description of Lucifer the archangel would include words such as "son of the morning", "shining one", "angel of light", "celebrate", "give praise", "full of wisdom", "perfect in beauty", "the anointed cherub that covereth", and "in the office of the priest, a minister unto the LORD".

Lucifer is a person who the devil used to be, but not anymore. After he sinned he became the devil and his current description would include words such as "a fallen rebel archangel", "unclean spirit", "father of lies", "murderer", "thief", "great red dragon", "adversary", "that old serpent", "the beast", "antichrist", and "Satan".

In certain reference books such as Strong's concordance and Webster's dictionary, Lucifer is defined as the morning star, which is consistent with Freemason philosophy. However, the King James Version of the Bible says that Lucifer is the son of the morning (Isaiah 14:12) and that Jesus is the bright and morning star (Revelation 22:16). The Bible should be the final authority, so exception is taken to Strong's and Webster's interpretations of "morning star" as being Lucifer. The King James Version is the final authority and so "morning star" is specifically and only in reference to Jesus.

Here is the Infinity Bible Code methodology for Lucifer's number and its corresponding verses:

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from 1984: to shine, show, boast, celebrate, give light, praise

- = 75
- = Exodus 25 (75th chapter of OT)

- = 2 Corinthians 1 ($75x2 = 150^{\text{th}}$ chapter of NT)

Comment: in these verses from Exodus, especially chapter 28, the reader is invited to replace the name of Aaron with Lucifer. We can then see the parallel description of Lucifer with Ezekiel 28, where every precious stone was his covering and that he held the office of priest, the personal minister unto the LORD. The breastplate of precious stones represented the twelve tribes of Israel. Then iniquity was found in Lucifer by the multitude of his merchandise. Lucifer's sin against the LORD was the ultimate act of betrayal. In Isaiah 14 and Ezekiel 28 we see the sin described in some detail. The pattern repeats with Judas, a type of priest, who gets offended and then betrays Jesus for money. Lucifer had responsibility with gold and Judas was responsible for the moneybag. Again the pattern repeats with Aaron, who was in the priest's office, betraying Moses by making a golden calf with the gold he took from the people. If someone wants to examine the maturity level of any person of God, see how they handle money or power. If they have any issues in this area, they are not to be entrusted with the holy things of the LORD, including leadership.

Comment: Urim = "lights", the oracular brilliancy of the figures of the breastplate (Strong's 224), Thummim = "perfections", one of the epithets of objects in the breastplate as an emblem of complete truth (Strong's 8550).

Comment: in verse 37 above notice that he wore a mitre upon his head. Question: which leading religious figure in the world today wears a mitre upon his head and is adorned in gold, purple, and scarlet and whose primary business is banking? He lives in Rome. It has been said that on his mitre are inscribed the words: *Vicarius Filii Dei* (Latin for "Vicar of the Son of God"). The context of the inscription is that he is the substitute for God.

⁴³⁸And <u>Aaron the priest went up into mount Hor</u> at the commandment of the LORD, and died there, in the fortieth year after the children of Israel were come out of the land of Egypt, in the first *day* of the fifth month. ³⁹And Aaron *was* an hundred and twenty and three years old when <u>he died in mount Hor</u>." Numbers 33:38-39

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Comment: the verses from Numbers 33 appear to illustrate that when Lucifer sinned in God's holy mountain, he spiritually "died" there and was removed and is consequently destined for the lake of fire. After his sin, every remnant of Lucifer's idolatry was removed out of God's 3rd heaven. To this day, Lucifer/Satan erects the same type of idolatry wherever he can throughout the earth.

^{«1}And Samson went down to Timnath, and saw a woman in Timnath of the daughters of the Philistines. ²And he came up, and told his father and his mother, and said, <u>I have seen a woman</u> in Timnath of the daughters of the Philistines: now therefore <u>get her for me to wife</u>. ³Then his father and his mother said unto him, *Is there* never a woman among the daughters of thy brethren, or among all my people, that thou <u>goest to take a wife of the uncircumcised</u> Philistines? And Samson said unto his father, Get her for me; for she pleaseth me well."

Comment: the verses of Judges 14 appear to say that while Lucifer was in 3rd heaven he began to want a "wife". He may have caught on to God's redemptive plan of saving a remnant out of an "uncircumcised" people to present as a bride for Jesus, even though Adam had not yet been created. Lucifer may have gotten jealous and wanted a people for himself and that is why, after he was kicked out of 3rd heaven, his fallen angels began taking wives from earthly men, see Genesis 6, and continue to do so unto this present day. So, the theme of Judges 14 appears to match Isaiah 14: "I will sit upon the mount of the congregation" (I want a people).

"¹After these things Jesus walked in Galilee: for he would not walk in Jewry, because <u>the Jews sought to kill him</u>. ⁶Then Jesus said unto them, My time is not yet come: but your time is alway ready. ⁷<u>The world cannot hate you; but me it hateth</u>, because I testify of it, that <u>the works thereof are evil</u>. ⁸Go ye up unto this feast: I go not up yet unto this feast; for my time is not yet full come. ⁹When he had said these words unto them, he abode *still* in Galilee.

Comment: in these verses of John, it is apparent that when Jesus first perceived iniquity in Lucifer, He announced to him that there would be a complete and permanent separation of their relationship forever. Lucifer may not have fully appreciated the complete separation part but he did understand that they would be enemies now.

Comment: in these scriptures from 2 Corinthians 1, it appears to reveal that Lucifer experienced emotional suffering after his fall from grace, knowing that he had the sentence of death. Until his death in Revelation 20:10, he will continue to experience suffering, in contrast to God's people who suffer with the promise of being delivered from death; even a resurrection, and are thus comforted. Lucifer/Satan can never have this hope of eventual comfort and consolation.

"¹Likewise, ye wives, *be* in subjection to your own husbands; that, if any obey not the word, they also may without the word be won by the conversation of the wives; ²While they behold your chaste conversation *coupled* with fear. ³Whose adorning <u>let it not be that outward *adorning*</u> of plaiting the hair, and of wearing <u>of gold</u>, or of putting on <u>of apparel</u>; ⁴But <u>let it be the hidden man of the heart</u>, in that which is not corruptible, *even <u>the ornament</u>* of a meek and quiet spirit, which is in the sight of God of great price. ⁵For after this manner in the old time the holy women also, who trusted in God, adorned themselves, being in subjection unto their own husbands: ⁶Even as Sarah obeyed Abraham, calling him lord: whose daughters ye are, as long as ye do well, and are not afraid with any amazement. ⁷Likewise, ye husbands, dwell with *them* according to knowledge, giving honour unto the wife, as unto the weaker vessel, and as being heirs together of the grace of life; that your prayers be not hindered." 1 Peter 3:1-7

Comment: in the above verses from 1 Peter 3, we see a confirmation that Lucifer was distinguished by his outward beauty but the character flaw of iniquity in his inward personality was his undoing.

Here is another Infinity Bible Code number related to Lucifer:

"How art thou fallen from heaven, O Lucifer, **son of the morning**! *how* art thou cut down to the ground, which didst weaken the nations! ...But thou art cast out of thy grave like an abominable branch, *and as* the raiment of those that are slain, thrust through with a sword, that go down to <u>the stones of the pit</u>; as a carcase trodden under feet." Isaiah 14:12,19

ARCHANGEL DISCUSSION

There appears to be a possible comparison of the three archangels with the three apostles of Jesus: Peter, James, and John. The three archangels served the LORD in leadership roles. Jesus often took Peter, James, and John with him up to the mountains as a type of leadership council (Matthew 17:1, Luke 9:28, Mark 14:32-33).

Michael the archangel is associated with swinging the sword of judgment and with the resurrection. He is also known as the great prince of the children of the people of Israel. Peter was known to have swung the sword (he cut off an ear in John 18:10) and he prayed for a woman named Tabitha and she came back to life (Acts 9:40). Peter was also the apostle sent with the gospel to the Jews (and Paul to the Gentiles, Gal. 2:7). However, Peter denied Jesus three times but he didn't betray Jesus. The Bible is very specific that the only disciple that betrayed Jesus was Judas Iscariot. There is one instance where Michael and Peter are actually in the same place together when the archangel Michael smote Peter on the side to wake him when he was helping him escape from prison (Acts 12:7).

Gabriel the archangel is associated with bringing very important messages and prophetic revelations to certain people of God. There is not a lot of information on the apostle James but the Lord did use him to write the epistle of James and share important messages on patience, wisdom, temptation, sanctification, and pure religion. Herod did have James killed with the sword (Acts 12:1) and in the book of Matthew there is another Herod who wants to kill Jesus but the angel of the Lord appears to Joseph in a dream and instructs him to flee to Egypt with his family (Matt. 2:13). The angel was Gabriel because he had already appeared to Joseph and Mary to give them the news that the baby's name would be JESUS (Matt. 1:18-25, Luke 1:26-38). So, Gabriel and James had the person named Herod in common.

As discussed in a previous section, Lucifer the archangel is associated with having been the personal minister unto the LORD. The apostle John is associated with being the one whom Jesus loved (John 13:23-25, 19:26, 20:2). The same was also said of Lazarus (John 11:5); however, John was the one who

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would lay his head on the Lord's chest. John was a type of personal minister to Jesus and it could be that he was the closest one to Him. John was also the one who asked Jesus who it was that would betray him. John never betrayed Jesus but Lucifer did. This is a grave lesson for anyone with a personal minister or in the role of personal minister: guard against betrayal.

In the book of Revelation judgment falls upon the third part of creation and it signifies the corruption associated with the third part of the angels that fell from grace. Other patterns for consideration are:

Three brothers: Cain, Abel, & Seth; one fell from grace (Cain). Three archangels: Lucifer, Gabriel, & Michael; one fell from grace. Cain / Lucifer = tiller of the ground, keeper of the earth. Abel / Gabriel = keeper of the sheep. Seth / Michael = patriarch of the generations of Israel. Three other brothers: Shem, Ham, Japheth; one fell from grace (Ham).

JESUS

A description of Jesus from the scriptures includes such words as "Wonderful", "Counsellor", "The mighty God", "The everlasting Father", "The Prince of Peace", "Christ the Lord", "Immanuel", "Son of God", "I am the way, the truth, and the life", "I am Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end, the first and the last.", "I am he that liveth, and was dead", "the Lion of the tribe of Juda", "I am the root and the offspring of David", "the Lamb that was slain", and "the bright and morning star".

The Old Testament does talk about Jesus and it also refers to occasions when He is manifest in the spirit, which we see in certain of the following verses:

Psalms 2:7 "...the LORD hath said unto me, Thou *art* my Son; this day have I begotten thee."
Psalms 2:12 "Kiss the Son, lest he be angry, and ye perish *from* the way…"
Proverbs 30:4-6 "Who hath ascended up into heaven, or descended? who hath gathered the wind in his fists? who hath bound the waters in a garment? who hath established all the ends of the earth? what *is* his name, and what *is* his son's name, if thou canst tell? Every word of God *is* pure: he *is* a shield unto them that put their trust in him. Add thou

not unto his words. lest he reprove thee, and thou be found a liar."

Daniel 3:25 "...the form of the fourth is like the Son of God."

Daniel 7:13 "...behold, one like the Son of man came with the clouds of heaven, and came to the

Ancient of days..."

Daniel 8:15-16 "...behold, there stood before me as the appearance of a man. And I heard a man's voice between *the banks of* Ulai, which called, and said, Gabriel, make this *man* to understand the vision."

Jesus is not an archangel and had no "brothers". He is the only begotten (John 3:16), He is the Word, He is the creator of all things, and the archangels are His creation (John 1:1-3,14).

Verses concerning JESUS:

"And he that overcometh, and keepeth my works unto the end, to him will I give power over the nations: And he shall rule them with a rod of iron; as the vessels of a potter shall they be broken to shivers: even as I received of my Father. And I will give him <u>the morning star</u>." Revelation 2:26-28

"I Jesus have sent mine angel to testify unto you these things in the churches. I am the root and the offspring of David, and the bright and morning star." Revelation 22:16

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OTHER

The next chapter discusses other spiritual beings such as the Cherubim and Seraphim, and Chapter 29 continues the discussion with a review of Ezekiel 10 and John 10. Chapter 30, Four Door, contains additional deep insights on the four beasts and their revelation of the attributes of Jesus.

THE BIBLE PATTERN

In the Bible pattern that follows, Luke 1 contains three sections of scripture that line up with each other and line up with Judges 13 to form a pattern match concerning the visitation of the angel Gabriel with the families of John the Baptist, Jesus, and Samson. The same pattern of events takes place. The angel tells the barren wives that they will have a son. The child is to be set apart as a Nazarite for the Lord's service. The pattern shows that Manoah's wife was visited by the angel when her husband was not there and this matches Eve's visitation by the serpent when her husband Adam was not there. The danger of the forbidden fruit of wrong knowledge is that it is a bad seed that tries to take root in the soul to prevent the seed of promise and prevent the seed of truth from bringing forth the fruit of the Holy Spirit. The significance of the wine or strong drink is the impairment of judgment in doing the right thing. In a drunken moment of "weakness", the wrong thing can take place; thus, the necessity of the law of the Nazarite (Numbers 6:1-21), which is holy consecration of one's self unto the Lord so He can do great and mighty things through us. A bad seed can spring forth a spiritual vine of philosophy that is not biblical, not holy. A good spiritual vine results in a philosophy of holy biblical values.

Samuel 10 also has three sections of scripture that line up with each other. As discussed previously, the number of this Bible chapter also matches the number for Gabriel so it is a chapter for the archangel Gabriel. The attributes of nobility that describe Saul in this chapter also describe Gabriel.

CHAPTER 28

SERAPHIM & CHERUBIM

It is important to understand that the eyewitness account of Ezekiel appears to be an attempt to describe the throne room and the glory of it and also of the four living creatures and their wheels. It is even more important to understand that the account in the Bible is an exact archive of how God wanted it described. In other words, the carnal-thinking person would say that Ezekiel wrote an approximate description of what he saw. However, the spiritual-thinking person would realize that God wanted these exact words used in the description of Ezekiel's experience. THE BIBLE DOES NOT WASTE OR MISUSE WORDS. Let that revelation sink in for a moment.

Many times in the prophetic scriptures of the Bible, symbology is used to portray beings, things, kingdoms, etc. Sometimes what appears to be symbology is actually a situation where words are inadequate to describe spiritual things. Thus, in many cases the words "like" or "as" will be used when describing the indescribable.

In the following pattern there are four columns that match-up the chapters of Isaiah 6, Ezekiel 1, Ezekiel 10, and Revelation 4 concerning creatures known as seraphim and cherubim. Ezekiel 1 verses were kept in sequential order while verses in the other columns are not in sequence, in order to match them with Ezekiel 1 verses. The result is a comparison of the two types of creatures and their similarities:

CHAPTER 29

EZEKIEL 10 & JOHN 10

This chapter highlights another one of those reverse pattern comparisons and this time the right column from the book of John is in reverse order chronologically as it compares with Ezekiel. The subject matter between the two columns match, in keeping with the theory of Bible numerics where similarly numbered chapters / books have similar subject matter. For example: Ezekiel 10 and John 10, or Exodus 15 and Revelation 15, etc.

In this chapter there are interesting comparisons between coals of fire and the words of Jesus. There is also an amazing comparison of how the cherubim are symbolic of the attributes of Jesus. This is covered in more detail in the next chapter titled "Four Door".

When one first reads about the wheels in the book of Ezekiel it can be confusing as to exactly what is the spiritual significance of these wheels. In using a comparison with a matching Bible chapter, it becomes clear that the wheel is symbolic of being a follower of Jesus. It turns not to the left, nor to the right, because it follows His voice. The wheel is symbolic of the sheep and the cherubim are symbolic of the sheepherd.

CHAPTER 30

FOUR DOOR

Psalm 119:25-32 are the verses for "Daleth" which is the 4th letter of the Hebrew alphabet and it means "door". These verses are compared with John (4th book of the New Testament) and with Revelation Chapter 4. The resulting pattern in the next 22 pages is very powerful because 4 is a very important number. There are two major sections from the pattern that blossom forth.

The first section has to do with the resurrection scriptures (Psalm 119:25-27, Revelation 4:1-4) and the test of faith that takes place for the following groups of people from the book of John:

- 1.) The Jews of the temple in Jerusalem
- 2.) The disciples before the resurrection of Lazarus
- 3.) Martha at the resurrection of Lazarus
- 4.) Mary at the resurrection of Lazarus
- 5.) The council of the chief priests and Pharisees
- 6.) Supper with Jesus, Lazarus, & Mary, where Judas comments about the ointment of spikenard
- 7.) People rejoicing at Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem with the Pharisees complaining
- 8.) The Greeks at the feast with Philip and Andrew

In each of the eight "episodes" above, it begins with either someone in unbelief, someone is dead, or someone is thirsty for spiritual water (wants to see Jesus). Their soul "cleaveth unto the dust" of unbelief until Jesus arrives to resurrect them or to quench their thirst.

In many of the episodes, even after Jesus arrives there is still unbelief spoken or demonstrated... "I have declared my ways". This illustrates the level of immaturity that God's people have initially as they grow in the Lord. However, the Lord expects us to mature and that maturity will be tested as demonstrated in the book of Acts.

The scriptures that match up with Revelation 4:2-4 tell us that if we will walk in a higher level of faith, we will be closer to witnessing the glory of God. Words and actions of unbelief separate people from the glory. That's why Moses had to put a boundary around the foot of God's holy mountain Sinai or the people in unbelief would have been consumed (Exodus 19:12).

The second section of the pattern concerns the revelation of the attributes of Jesus by symbolic comparison to the four beasts: the lion, the calf, the man, and the flying eagle. It shows how Jesus was operating in the maturity of these attributes while the disciples were operating immaturely. Eventually the disciples would walk in maturity, even to the point of martyrdom. Study the attributes of this pattern closely. The revelation of it is surprising.

CHAPTER 31

THE RESURRECTIONS

A fundamental belief of Christianity is that Jesus is risen from the dead and without His resurrection there is no Christian faith (1 Cor. 15:12-14). Believers in Jesus are made in the image of God and those who have passed away will also be risen from the dead (1 Cor. 15:51-57). In order for there to be a resurrection, the person must be physically dead first, otherwise there is no need.

There are <u>two resurrections</u> that will take place for all of humanity: the resurrection of the just (saved people) and the resurrection of the unjust (unsaved people). (see also John 5:29)

"And have hope toward God, which they themselves also allow, that there shall be a resurrection of the dead, both of <u>the just and unjust</u>." Acts 24:15

The resurrection of the just is the 1st resurrection and the resurrection of the unjust is the 2nd resurrection and they occur in that order (Rev. 20:4-6).

Contained in 1 Corinthians 15 and 1 Thessalonians 4 are some of the more well-known verses concerning the resurrection of the just:

"So also *is* the resurrection of the dead. It is sown in corruption; it is <u>raised in incorruption</u>: It is sown in dishonour; it is <u>raised in glory</u>: it is sown in weakness; it is <u>raised in power</u>: It is sown a natural body; it is <u>raised a spiritual body</u>..." 1 Corinthians 15:42-44

"Behold, I show you a mystery; <u>We shall not all sleep</u>, but we shall all be changed, In a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trump: for the trumpet shall sound, and <u>the dead shall be</u> raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed. For this corruptible must put on incorruption, and this mortal *must* put on immortality. So when this corruptible shall have put on incorruption, and this mortal shall have put on immortality, then shall be brought to pass the saying that is written, Death is swallowed up in victory. O death, where *is* thy sting? O grave, where *is* thy victory? The sting of death *is* sin; and the strength of sin *is* the law. But thanks *be* to God, which giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ."

"But I would not have you to be ignorant, brethren, <u>concerning them which are asleep</u>, that ye sorrow not, even as others which have no hope. For if we believe that Jesus died and rose again,

even so them also which sleep in Jesus will God bring with him. For this we say unto you by the word of the Lord, that we which are alive *and* remain unto the coming of the Lord shall not prevent them which are asleep. For the Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of God: and <u>the dead in Christ shall rise first</u>: Then we which are alive *and* remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord. Wherefore comfort one another with these words."

In Revelation 20, <u>the second resurrection</u> takes place <u>for the unjust</u> and it occurs at the end of Christ's thousand-year reign on the earth. The unjust are resurrected for purposes of their final judgment at the Great White Throne.

"And I saw a great white throne, and him that sat on it, from whose face the earth and the heaven

fled away; and there was found no place for them. And I saw the dead, small and great, stand before God; and the books were opened: and another book was opened, which is *the book* of life: and the dead were judged out of those things which were written in the books, according to their works. And <u>the sea gave up the dead</u> which were in it; and <u>death and hell delivered up the dead</u> which were in them: and they were judged every man according to their works. And death and

hell were cast into the lake of fire. This is the second death. And whosoever was not found written in the book of life was cast into the lake of fire." Revelation 20:11-15

So, believers in Jesus have a future resurrection of the just to look forward to. However, there has already been a resurrection of the just. When Jesus rose from the dead He became immortal and the saints who had passed away also rose from the dead immortal and ascended with Him to heaven, on the Feast of Firstfruits in the springtime.

"And the graves were opened; and many bodies of the saints which slept arose, And came out of the graves after his resurrection, and went into the holy city, and appeared unto many." Matthew 27:52-53

"But now is Christ risen from the dead, *and* become the firstfruits of them that slept." 1 Corinthians 15:20

Very few people know that the resurrection of the just comes in three parts (per Al Neal research):

"For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ shall all be made alive. But every man in his own order: Christ the firstfruits; (Part 1: Old Testament saints) afterward they that are Christ's at his coming. (Part 2: New Testament saints) Then cometh the end, (Part 3: tribulation saints)
...when he shall have delivered up the kingdom to God, even the Father; when he shall have put

down all rule and all authority and power. For he must reign, till he hath put all enemies under his feet. The last enemy *that* shall be destroyed *is* death." 1 Corinthians 15:22-26

The timeline sequence of the three parts is as follows:

Part 1 took place 2000 years ago when Jesus arose from the grave (Matt. 27:52-53).

Part 2 will take place just prior to the 3½ year Great Tribulation (Rev. 4:1, Rev. 12:5). (see also Rev. 7:3-4 and Rev. 14:1)

Part 3 will take place at the end of the Great Tribulation and will also have the remaining believers who are still alive caught up with the Lord (1 Thess. 4:16-17, Rev. 10:7, Rev. 11:15, Rev. 16:15-17).

The following pages contain the Bible pattern which reveals the above conclusions.

In addition to underlined words in the following pages, there are key words that are highlighted in blue: voice / trumpet, earthquake, and resurrection / come up hither. This makes it easier to follow the main pattern in the midst of the details.

There are also some very curious verses in the Bible pattern for further study:

Prior to Part 2 of the resurrection of the just, the Lord speaks and the people of the world go backward, fall down, or go down (John 18:6, Matt. 24:2, Prov. 25:7).

Prior to Part 3 of the resurrection of the just, angels are coming down from the heavens, both good and bad angels (Matt. 28:2, Rev. 6:13, Rev. 10:1). (see also Rev. 9:1)

APPENDIX A

HEBREW LETTER "77" (HE)

In the Old Testament, certain individuals have the letter "H" in their name; however, in the New Testament the names of these same individuals have a different spelling. The "H" is no longer there and is sometimes substituted with an "S".

The Hebrew letter for "H" is ", "(HE) and it means to behold or to see with the eyes. One of the central themes in the New Testament is:

"For we walk by faith, not by sight:"

2 Corinthians 5:7

The word "faith" appears in the Old Testament two times but it appears in the New Testament over 200 times. Apparently, in order to emphasize the importance of faith, the names of certain Old Testament individuals have a different spelling in the New Testament so that the focus is on believing and not on seeing; on the spiritual and not on the physical; on Jesus and not on the law.

APPENDIX B

BIBLE ARCHAEOLOGY

Jerusalem was historically vulnerable from an attack from the north because of access by Mount Moriah. The city was relatively safe from attack from the east, west, and south due to the valleys. Historical records indicate that crucifixion sites were alongside major roads out of the city, with the northern exit out of the city being a primary road to Damascus via the Damascus gate. It is along this road to the north that the hill of Golgotha is adjacent and it is the site where Jesus was crucified. Jerusalem is geographically described as follows:

<u>WEST</u> Mount Zion – captured and named City of David Hinnom Valley – boundary between Judah and Benjamin <u>NORTH</u>

Mount Moriah – site of Solomon's Temple and site of Golgotha hill where Jesus was crucified and the Ark of the Covenant is presently located Tyropoeon Valley – central Jerusalem <u>EAST</u>

Mount of Olives – site of the ascension of Jesus and His future return to earth Kidron Valley – a common burial ground

APPENDIX D

BOOK OF DANIEL CHRONOLOGICAL ORDER

The book of Daniel is not written in chronological order. It is better described as semi-chronological. Following below are the chapters of Daniel in chronological order along with major events of the chapter. The chronology clue is that in the first verse of most of the chapters there will be the year of the reign of the king that ruled over the land of Israel during the time of Daniel, around 534 B.C. The kings ruled in the following order: Jehoiakim king of Judah, Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon, Belshazzar son of Nebuchadnezzar and king of Babylon, Darius king of Media (the Medes), and Cyrus king of Persia. Two hundred years later in the year 333 B.C. Persia is conquered by Alexander the Great of the Macedonian Empire (Grecia). In the year 168 B.C., the Roman Empire becomes a power by defeating the kingdom of Macedon and reaches the fullness of power around the year 80 A.D. The Roman Empire ceases to exist around the year 426 A.D. and is replaced by the spiritual Roman Empire of the Vatican which will eventually transition into the one world government of the last days.

Daniel Chapter 1:

Nebuchadnezzar besieges Jerusalem and overthrows Jehoiakim in the third year of Jehoiakim's reign.

Daniel Chapter 2:

Nebuchadnezzar is in the second year of his reign and dreams of a great image. Head of gold symbolizes Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon.

Breast & arms of silver symbolize Darius king of Media and Cyrus king of Persia (Medo-Persia).

Belly & thighs of brass symbolize Alexander the Great, king of Macedonia (Grecia).

Legs of iron symbolize Caesar, emperor of Roman Empire.

Feet & toes of iron and clay symbolize the Pope, emperor of post-Roman Empire.

Daniel Chapter 3:

Nebuchadnezzar sets up an image of gold and throws three Jewish youth into the fire. The LORD delivers the youth out of the fire. Nebuchadnezzar's ego was inflated after his dream in Daniel chapter 2 about him being the head of gold. Thus motivated, he proceeded to set up an image of gold that required all to worship. Three Jewish youth got into trouble for not worshipping; why not Daniel? One brother's insight was that the golden image that Nebuchadnezzar set up was an image of Daniel. Thus, Daniel was not required to bow down to his own image and was not thrown into the fire.

In verse 3:25, it appears that Nebuchadnezzar saw Jesus in the spirit: "He answered and said, Lo, I see four men loose, walking in the midst of the fire, and they have no hurt; and the form of the fourth is like the Son of God."

Daniel Chapter 4:

Nebuchadnezzar praises God, has a dream of a hewn down tree, becomes a beast for seven years, and then finally praises God again.

Daniel Chapter 7:

Belshazzar is in the first year of his reign when Daniel has a "night vision" of four great beasts. The lion with eagle's wings, plucked, is Babylon overthrown by Medo-Persia.

The bear with 3 ribs in its teeth is Medo-Persia devouring Babylon, Egypt, and Media.

The leopard with 4 heads/wings of a fowl is the Macedonian kingdom when it comes to power and then splits into four pieces: Egypt, Greece/Macedonia, Persia/Asia Minor, and Seleucid Syria.

The 4th beast with iron teeth is the Roman Empire; physical Rome followed by spiritual Rome.

There is a future fulfillment of the four beasts in the last days with the 1st beast being the U.S.A. and the 4th beast being the one world government. The little horn is the antichrist.

For more detail, see Appendix K of volume one of The Two Witnesses book.

In verse 7:13, this is one of the verses of the Old Testament that acknowledges the Father and the Son: "I saw in the night visions, and, behold, *one* like the Son of man came with the clouds of heaven, and came to the Ancient of days, and they brought him near before him."

In verse 7:16, Daniel talks to an angel: "I came near unto one of them that stood by, and asked him the truth of all this. So he told me, and made me know the interpretation of the things." (The angel Gabriel.)

APPENDIX D

BOOK OF DANIEL CHRONOLOGICAL ORDER

Daniel Chapter 8:

Belshazzar is in the third year of his reign. Daniel has a "morning vision" of a ram and he-goat and also of the succeeding king of fierce countenance.

In verses 8:15-16, it appears that Jesus is in the spirit and orders the angel Gabriel to explain the vision to Daniel: "And it came to pass, when I, *even* I Daniel, had seen the vision, and sought for the meaning, then, behold, there stood before me as the appearance of a man. And I heard a man's voice between *the banks of* Ulai, which called, and said, Gabriel, make this *man* to understand the vision."

The ram with two horns is the kingdom of Medo-Persia.

The he-goat of Grecia is the kingdom of Macedonia and the great horn is Alexander the Great. The four notable horns that come out of the great horn are Egypt, Greece/Macedonia, Persia/Asia Minor, and Seleucid Syria.

The little horn is Yasser Arafat, born in Egypt, and his successor will be an antichrist type.

Daniel Chapter 5:

Belshazzar feasts with the vessels of God's temple (sacrilege). Daniel reads the writing on the wall. It prophesies that Babylon will be overthrown by the kingdom of Medo-Persia. Belshazzar is slain.

Daniel Chapter 9:

Darius the Mede is in the first year of his reign. Daniel makes a prayer of supplication and in the evening he receives the revelation of the 70 weeks from the archangel Gabriel.

Daniel Chapter 6:

Darius sets up Daniel as 1 of 3 presidents. Daniel is thrown into the lion's den and then delivered. Darius glorifies the God of Daniel. What is the identity of the angel in verse 6:22 "My God hath sent his angel, and hath shut the lions' mouths, that they have not hurt me…"?

Daniel Chapter 10:

Cyrus the Persian is in the third year of his reign. The archangel Gabriel battles the prince of Persia (a fallen angel) with the help of Michael (the archangel). Gabriel then appears to Daniel and Daniel sees a great vision and passes out. When Gabriel leaves he has to return and "...fight with the prince of Persia: and when I am gone forth, Io, the prince of Grecia shall come." While Cyrus the Persian is in power, the fallen angel known as the prince of Persia (a high-ranking demonic principality) has territorial rights in that area. After Alexander the Great (Grecia) defeats Persia, then the fallen angel known as the prince of Grecia will have territorial rights over that area. It appears that the Lord's angels have to do battle from time to time when they enter hostile territory to relay messages to the saints.

Daniel Chapter 11:

Gabriel then explains the vision of the time of the end to Daniel. The verse: "1st year of Darius" is not a chronological verse but is in reference to Daniel 9:21. For a discussion of Daniel chapter 11 and its meaning, see volume one of <u>The Two Witnesses</u> book, Chapter 28. It explains that Daniel chapter 11 had a historical fulfillment and it will also have a future fulfillment, taking place even now. The main focus of Daniel chapter 11 is that Israel will be attacked from within by Arab neighbors and from without by Rome and its agents. Daniel 11:21-31 corresponds to the little horn of Daniel chapter 8 and Daniel 11:40-45 corresponds to the little horn of Daniel chapter 7.

Daniel Chapter 12:

The archangel Gabriel continues with an explanation of the time of Jacob's trouble (the great tribulation) and the sign of Israel being delivered by Michael the archangel. The resurrection takes place. In verses 12:6-7, "the man clothed in linen" is referring to an angel. What is his identity?

APPENDIX E

BOOK OF REVELATION CHRONOLOGICAL ORDER

Before someone can attempt to put the book of Revelation into chronological order, it must be understood that it is composed of two halves: a first witness and a second witness. In the following chart there is a dark border around Chapters 6-10 because it is the first witness and there is a dark border around Chapters 11-18 because it is the second witness. It represents the same subject matter told twice.

"...In the mouth of two or three witnesses shall every word be established." 2 Cor. 13:1

The general subject matter is the same in these two halves of scripture but each half contains certain details that the other does not so that the whole together represents the entire story. This principle is also true with the four Gospels.

For example, there is only one group of 144,000 that are sealed but because the story appears twice in Chapters 7 and 14, there have been prophecy books written that say there are two groups of 144,000! Be careful what you read.

In the following chart, the first major sequence of events is the seven seals and the second major sequence of events is the seven trumpets/bowls/vials. The reader must take the time necessary to understand the chart because it is not possible with just a glance. There is too much information on it to absorb if it is being read quickly.

What can be seen is that there is a tremendous amount of activity that takes place during the fifth seal. This will be a time of testing and trial for God's people and if we can endure until the sixth seal, then that is when God will place His remnant in a type of land of Goshen, most likely near Jerusalem (Rev. 11:13, Jeremiah 51:50). We will be on the "sidelines" while God pours out His trumpet judgments upon the devil's kingdom until the Second Coming of Jesus.

INFINITY BIBLE CODE ALPHABETS

Appendix I of volume one of <u>The Two Witnesses</u> has a short introduction to the Infinity Bible Code. Basically, each letter of the alphabet has a numerical value. By summing the values of the letters in a word the numerical value of the word is discovered. The number of a person's name can be determined in the same way as with any word. The person can then go to the corresponding chapters in the Bible that match the number of a word or person's name. A person's first, second, and last name each have a number as well as the whole name. An example is included in this appendix, using the English alphabet. APPENDIX G

TRIUMPHAL ENTRY

APPENDIX G

TRIUMPHAL ENTRY

In the following Bible pattern from the four Gospels, the contrast between believers and unbelievers continues, except it goes to a deeper level of revelation as to the spiritual consequence of unbelief.

The subject is the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem, a few days before the Feast of Passover. The people rejoiced as their Messiah came into the city while the religious leaders (chief priests, scribes, Pharisees, Sadducees) were offended and opposed the idea that Jesus be received as the King of Israel. Please refer to Chapter 26 (Descent from the Mount) for details of the revelation that the triumphal entry was a type for the journey of three days and three nights that Jesus took into the heart of the earth in order to lead captivity captive.

APPENDIX H

MATTHEW MARK LUKE JOHN

This chapter is a good study tool for use as a reference when studying the chronological sequence of the events that occurred during the arrest, trial, crucifixion, burial, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus. This part of the four Gospels was harmonized in order to make it easier to follow the sequential action that took place during this period in the life of Jesus 2000 years ago. It can be used to check the accuracy of Jesus movies such as "The Passion of Christ" or "Jesus of Nazareth" to see how closely they followed the Bible.

One side note: it has been said that the ministry of Jesus was three and a half years long. When the book of John is studied, it supports this because there are clearly three Passover feasts that take place:

APPENDIX I

CRUCIFIXION & RESURRECTION CHRONOLOGY

This chapter is a subset of the previous chapter. It illustrates the complete New Testament chronology of the crucifixion and resurrection sequence of Jesus Christ, using a core group of verses from the gospels and the book of Acts. It is a <u>quick-reference</u> tool for the student who is primarily interested in studying the sequence of events that happened first, second, third, etc. during the crucifixion and resurrection only.

The selected verses are arranged in chronological order in order to illustrate the crucifixion and resurrection sequence of Jesus Christ.

JOHN 19:

¹⁷And he bearing his cross went forth into a place called *the place* of a skull, which is called in the Hebrew Golgotha:

¹⁸Where they crucified him, and two other with him, on either side one, and Jesus in the midst.

MARK 15:

³³And when the sixth hour was come, there was darkness over the whole land until the ninth hour.

³⁴And at the ninth hour Jesus cried with a loud voice, saying, Eloi, Eloi, lama sabachthani? which is, being interpreted, My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me?

³⁵And some of them that stood by, when they heard *it*, said, Behold, he calleth Elias.

JOHN 19:

²⁸After this, Jesus knowing that all things were now accomplished, that the scripture might be fulfilled, saith, I thirst.

²⁹Now there was set a vessel full of vinegar: and they filled a sponge with vinegar, and put *it* upon hyssop, and put *it* to his mouth.

³⁰When Jesus therefore had received the vinegar, he said, It is finished: and he bowed his head, and gave up the ghost.

MATTHEW 27:

⁵¹And, behold, the veil of the temple was rent in twain from the top to the bottom; and the earth did quake, and the rocks rent;

⁴⁴And Pilate marvelled if he were already dead: and calling *unto him* the centurion, he asked him whether he had been any while dead.

⁴⁵And when he knew *it* of the centurion, he gave the body to Joseph.

JOHN 19:

³⁹And there came also Nicodemus, which at the first came to Jesus by night, and brought a mixture of myrrh and aloes, about an hundred pound *weight*.

pound *weight*.⁴⁰Then took they the body of Jesus, and wound it in linen clothes with the spices, as the manner of the Jews is to bury.

⁴¹Now in the place where he was crucified there was a garden; and in the garden a new sepulchre, wherein was never man yet laid.

⁴²There laid they Jesus therefore because of the Jews' preparation *day*; for the sepulchre was nigh at hand.

⁶⁵Pilate said unto them, Ye have a watch: go your way, make *it* as sure as ye can.

⁶⁶So they went, and made the sepulchre sure, sealing the stone, and setting a watch.

¹...Mary Magdalene, and Mary the *mother* of James, and Salome, had bought sweet spices, that they might come and anoint him.

¹²And when they were assembled with the elders, and had taken
